

FORMED-What to Watch:

As we begin the month of May, a month dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary, there are several options to view - Lectio: Mary: The Bible and the Mother of God. Why is Mary so important to Catholics, and why have so many people been devoted to her over the centuries? In this 8-part series, Dr. Brandt Pitre examines what the Old and New Testaments, the life of Christ, and the early Church fathers reveal about the life and identity of Mary. Each episode is a half hour in length.

Another recommendation is to learn more about the life of St. Damien of Molokai, whose feast day is May 10. St. Damien spent most of his life ministering to leper colonies on the Hawaiian island of Molokai. Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten



The 5th Sunday of Easter - May 7, 2023

In today's gospel, Jesus had spent a lot of time with his disciples, and even having spent all that time getting to know the Lord, Phillip said, "Show us the Father and that will be enough for us." It goes to show that Phillip and the apostles didn't really know Jesus, either, even after all that time together.

Sometimes we can be like Phillip and not realize the many different ways Jesus cares for us. Sometimes we, too, can be like Phillip, when we say, "Just show us the Father, Lord, and that will help our faith. Then we'll know that you are really the Messiah, and we will follow. Just give us a little miracle!" Sometimes our relationship with Jesus may be kind of weak and we'd like it to grow stronger.

We come to know Jesus and his care for us in many ways. One way is through prayer. As we enter into the month of May, it is a great time for us to deepen our relationship with Jesus' mother Mary through the rosary, who leads us to Jesus. We also come to know Jesus through the sacraments, and through church activities. Also, we come to know Jesus through the kindness shown to one another, through the works of mercy and charity. Eventually, this kindness comes back to us sooner or later. And, most often it is through the kindness shown to others that the awesome mystery of Christ begins to be revealed.

May we use these different ways to come to really know Jesus. Then we won't make the mistake Philip did, by spending all that time with Jesus, and not really getting to know Him! Some people end up leaving the flock, and they haven't really even gotten to know Jesus, the Chief Shepherd of the flock.




