



FORMED - What to Watch

The month of June is devoted to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. On June 16, the church celebrates the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, a celebration that reminds us of the deep and abiding love God has for humanity. Images of the Sacred Heart of Jesus often depict a flaming heart shining with divine light, pierced by a lance, and encircled by a crown of thorns. Jesus appeared to a young French nun named Sr. Margaret Mary of Alacoque as He wanted to encourage more and more people to love His Sacred Heart and what it means to do so. To learn more about the Sacred Heart of Jesus, open Formed and scroll to the title: What to watch this week and click on two presentations, one being about the Sacred Art itself and then view the Sacred Heart of Jesus discussion with Dr. Tim Gray and Dr. Ben Akers.

For kids, the Saints and Heroes Collection provides short videos on a selected number of Saints in an animated format. And, if you would like to view again or maybe watch for the first time, click on Formed's Favorites and view Season 1 of the Chosen along with accompanying Catholic commentary for each episode.

Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten



Jesus is telling the apostles and us in this weekend's gospel to be generous with the gifts we have received when he says, "The gift you have received give as a gift." Often when we hear the word "generosity," we think of being monetarily generous with our dollars. And this is good. But that is not the only way of being generous. When we lend to others our time and our talents, we, too are being generous.

There are many opportunities for us to be generous in our lives, for example with our vocations. Those who are married are called to be generous in spending time with their spouse and children. Those who are single many times are called to be generous in spending time with their parents or others in need.

There are plenty of opportunities for me to be generous, too, with my time and talents, although perhaps I don't always seize those opportunities. Jesus is being quite obvious in the gospel that he is speaking about the priesthood when he says, "The harvest is rich, but laborers are few; so ask the harvest-master to send out laborers for his harvest." Jesus is talking about ministerial priests like me. But He is also talking about the universal priesthood of the laity.

In a sense, we are all priests, though not all are called to offer the Sacrifice of the Mass as I do. Our common priesthood implies that each of us make sacrifices to God regularly, even to offer to God the whole day, which I try to do every morning with the morning offering. That way, our whole day is sanctified and made as a pleasing offering to God.

So may we be generous in giving of ourselves for others through sacrificing our time, our talents, and at times even our treasures for the building up of the kingdom of God. God will not be outdone in generosity.

Eucharistic Revival



The Church's firm belief in the Real Presence of Christ is reflected in the worship that we offer to the Blessed Sacrament in various ways, including Eucharistic Exposition, Adoration, and Benediction; Eucharistic Processions; and Forty Hours Devotions. In addition, the practices of reverently genuflecting before the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the tabernacle, bowing one's head prior to the reception of Holy Communion, and refraining from food and drink for at least one hour before receiving Communion are clear manifestations of the Church's Eucharistic faith.
