

Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten



Reflections on the Readings for the 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time Sunday, August 27, 2023

The gospel reading today focuses on Peter. We know that Peter was a fisherman by trade, that he had a wife, and that he died about 33 years after Jesus died. He died a martyr in Rome and was believed to have been crucified, not like Christ, but upside down, because he did not think himself worthy to die the same way Jesus did. Peter was a man who had faith. Several times in the gospel Peter makes a profession of faith such as in this weekend's gospel. This was one of Peter's better moments.

Peter also had some darker moments. Remember how, after Jesus was arrested, he denied that he even knew Jesus, not once, but three times! Peter is a little like you and me. He had his moments of faith, and his moments of crisis. But, eventually, his faith won out, and Peter was willing to lay down his own life for Christ. And, because of his faith, Jesus gave him the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Peter

is a good person to look to as an example of faith because we can see in him both the good as well as his stumbling blocks. And Peter overcame those stumbling blocks.

May God continue to pour out His love on us, and give us the grace of the Sacraments and the examples of good people such as Peter and the other saints to help us to become more like Jesus.

This reflection will be my last reflection until I come back from my sabbatical at the end of November, 1 am looking forward to the time for spiritual renewal. I think there are times when we all need a spiritual boost in our faith. I also look forward to coming back at the end of November and sharing with you new insights I will have discovered in my time away. I will occasionally keep in touch with the staff here at the parish, so if you'd like to know what I have been up to, you may ask them to see if I am keeping out of trouble! Since I also went to major seminary in Maryland, I will also plan on visiting classmates I haven't seen for over 30 years. I also look forward to auditing some classes at St. Mary's Seminary and looking forward to the amazing colors that it seems only the East Coast can bring during the fall season. I plan on spending the end of November down in Florida and will be back for the first weekend of Advent. December 2-3. leave the parish in the capable hands of my housemate, Fr. Tom Feltman. I will keep you all in my daily prayers and Masses, and please keep me in your prayers too.

Father Gary:

As you journey away for 3 months, we ask God to guide you in your travels and in all you do. May you experience the gift of spiritual growth on your sabbatical, may your studies and your prayers be fruitful. May you come back refreshed and excited for all that ministry can yet be in this church!


