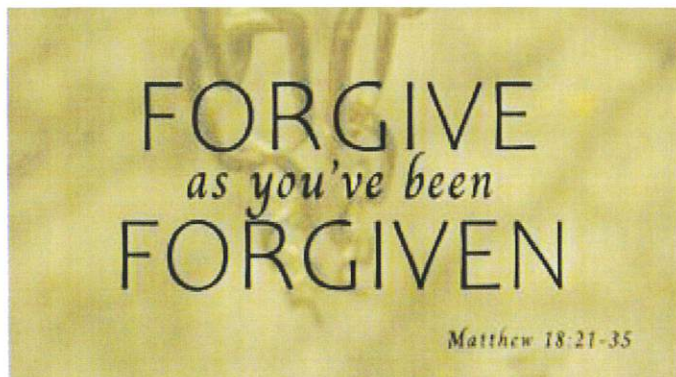

A Note from Fr. Gary Luiten

Greetings Parishioners,

I hope this finds you all well back at Blessed Sacrament. First, I want to thank everyone for the prayers, cards, gifts, upon my birthday and leaving on my sabbatical. The trip out to Baltimore went well. The accommodations here at St. Mary's Seminary in Baltimore (not to be confused with Mount St. Mary's Seminary in Emmitsburg MD, where I went to school back in seminary days) are wonderful. I am auditing three classes – The prophets of the Old Testament, the gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles, and Medical Moral Ethics. There were supposed to be 2 other priests here on sabbatical with me, but neither showed up, so I am the only one. But the seminarians, faculty, and staff are very welcoming. The professors are top-notch. This is the oldest seminary in the nation. It was here in Baltimore where St. Elizabeth Ann Seton made her religious vows back in 1808 at the old seminary downtown. I forgot about that in my studies. The house and chapel where she made those vows are still there, and it was inspiring to visit.

I offer Mass every day, and I offer the Mass at least once a week for you and your intentions. It has been either hot and humid or rainy, so I haven't been able to do much outside. Let us keep each other in prayer. God bless you!
