

FORMED-What to Watch: The "Recently Added" tab has two very interesting and important videos regarding a new approach to address homeless by a group of missionaries called Christ in the City. The titles are Homeless but Human: Inside Christ in the City which is a powerful 40- minute documentary that captures the transformation of individuals living on the streets that the Christ in the City missionaries encounter and showcases a new approach to the rising crisis of homelessness. The second very short presentation is called Christ in the City Presents, where three individuals share their stories about how the Christ in the City missionaries help them to transform their lives.

A second suggestion for the week is on the tab "Faith and Home" and take part in a short course on the Lord's Prayer with Dr. Ben Akers. When Jesus' disciples asked Him to show them how to pray, He gave them and us the Lord's Prayer. This is a six -session series that takes you line by line through the Lord's prayer, highlighting what it meant to Jesus' first century audience and what it means for us today. This will bring a whole new meaning to the Lord's prayer, and we pray it.

SOMETHING TO PONDER AND PRAY ABOUT!!!

- Our church, Blessed Sacrament Catholic Church, has 444 registered families!
- Of those 444 families, 130 families are involved in our parish in one form or another as far as serving above and beyond the weekly giving.
- It takes a minimum of 17 individuals to assist Father in celebrating the liturgy. With 3 services per weekend, 51 individuals are needed to be scheduled.
- If you think about it, that means Julie, our Parish Life Coordinator, has to constantly reach out to the same individuals to volunteer during Liturgy, for parish events (i.e., Fall Dinner, Thanksgiving Meal, Bingo), for Holy Days of Obligation, etc.
- All of this means there are approximately 314
 families that we would love to see get involved
 in Blessed Sacrament parish events and


