

Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten



Solemnity of the Holy Family - Dec. 31, 2023

Just a few days ago, we celebrated Christ's birthday. Now Joseph and Mary have a family. So today, it is fitting to celebrate the feast of the Holy Family: Mary, Joseph, and the child Jesus. The Holy Family presents themselves as a model for today's family: to imitate their holiness, their love, and their closeness to God.

Paul, in his letter to the Colossians, speaks of love among family members. Love, he says, involves forgiveness. A strong family needs to be a family that forgives each other. How hard that can be because we feel that if we forgive them, it seems as if we are saying that what they did was

all right. But that's not what we are saying when we forgive! What a person means when they forgive is that they did not appreciate the bad action, but they love the person too much to let this incident get in the way. So, love involves forgiveness.

But Paul says that family life is not just rooted in loving one another but is rooted in love of God. So, families and all of us are called to open our hearts to God. This is accomplished through prayer as individuals and as a family.

Living together as a family can be a challenge. It can be the worst experience, or it can be the best experience! With a firm ground in the love of God and the Sacraments, it can be the best of experiences. How important strong, God-centered families are, not only for the individual, but for the church, for society, and for the world as a whole. May the Holy Family inspire today's families to keep Jesus the center of their lives.

National Eucharistic Pilgrimage

Walking Coast to Coast With Our Eucharistic Lord!

The National Eucharistic Pilgrimage (procession) is a truly unique initiative. This is a beautiful fusion of the journey **TO** Jesus and the journey **WITH** Jesus. What's more, it is an adventure that all Catholics can do together, either by interior disposition or physical accompaniment.

This is the birth of something remarkable. Join us as we accompany Jesus in the Eucharist from the north, south, east, and west edges of our country, stopping at many holy sites and churches along the way. Each route is scheduled to arrive in Indianapolis IN, on July 21 to join the National Eucharistic Congress, where Jesus comes to encounter His people anew.

The four routes will come from the North (Minnesota), South (Texas), East (Connecticut), and West (California).

Who Is Involved?

JESUS CHRIST: Jesus will be the focus of the entire pilgrimage! Join us for segments of this massive expedition across the nation, physically walking side-by-side with our Risen Lord.

EUCHARISTIC CARAVAN: Those who meet up with the Pilgrimage and walk with us for any portion of the four routes—the Marian route, the Seton route, the Juan Diego route, or the Serra route—are part of our Eucharistic Caravan.

PERPETUAL PILGRIMS: A small, dedicated group of young adults will make the full journey to Indianapolis, traveling full-time from May 2024 until July. They will be led by clergy and followed by a support van.

<u>OUR GRACIOUS HOST</u>S: Our Perpetual Pilgrims will rely on the biblical hospitality of local hosts, including lay families, parishes, religious orders, schools, and shrines along the way.
