

Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten



The 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time - Jan. 14, 2024

Today's gospel answers two questions. The first question in the gospel today was posed by Jesus, who called out to the two disciples, "What are you looking for?" Jesus poses that same question to us. We come to Mass every Sunday and pray, hopefully every day. When we pray, what are we looking for? Hopefully, we are truly looking for the forgiveness of our sins from Jesus, peace of mind and heart, joy, and a chance to praise, thank, and ask God for the things we need.

The disciples then answer Jesus' question with another question, "Where are you staying?" Jesus responds by saying, "Come, and you will see," It is good for us to know where and when we can find Jesus, especially during those most important times of our lives. We need to know where we can find him if we need him. If we were to ask Jesus that question today, "Where are you staying?" Jesus would say several things. He would say "You can find Me in the Eucharist." Jesus would also say, "I am with the Father in Heaven." Jesus spoke often in the gospels about going to be with the Father. We profess in the creed that Jesus is seated "at the right hand of the Father." So, Jesus is truly in heaven. We are also taught that Jesus lives in the hearts of the faithful. That is another home. When we want Jesus, we can also turn to the other members of the Body of Christ and find Him there, too.

Jesus responds to the two disciples with the answer, "Come, and you will see (where I stay)." This is not only an invitation to the disciples, but also an on-going invitation to us, to follow Him. This is what makes this season of ordinary time extraordinary — realizing that Jesus is present in the ordinary events of our daily lives. May God give us the grace to continue to seek him where He is present in the world and help us to realize that without God, our lives are doomed to fail, whereas with Him, all things are possible.


2024 Pastoral Council Candidates


