Catholic Schools Week

January 28 through February 3 marks the celebration of Catholic education. The week is celebrated with Mass, assemblies and other activities for students, families, parishioners. and community members. The 2024 theme is: "Catholic Schools:

United in Faith and Community."

Trinity Elementary is supported by Blessed Sacrament, St. Benedict, and Holy Cross. Blessed Sacrament has several students that attend JPII Catholic Schools. Our Knights of Columbus men will help us celebrate Catholic Schools week by hosting a supper. The date will be announced in a later bulletin. - New and better signage has gone up.
- The Fire Alarm system has been updated.
- Installation of one-way window film to all entrance doors, indoor office windows, and others.
- All Social Hall doors remain locked unless the hall is in use.
- All Classrooms are locked unless the classroom(s) are in use.

The team has plans for more first aid kits, more fire extinguishers, additional signs, window breakers, and more. If you would like to be a part of this team, come to the meeting on January 11!

Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten



The Solemnity of the Epiphany – Jan. 7, 2024

Our thoughts on this solemnity are drawn to the three wise men and the star. This makes the nativity scene complete. They brought gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh to Jesus. Gold represents the kingship of Jesus. Frankincense shows that Jesus was and is sacred and, in fact, God. Myrrh was a nard, or a perfume reserved for burial. It was to reveal to the world that he is human, and it would foreshadow his death. So, these wise men were indeed wise, wiser than one may realize, and probably wiser than many people today.

Their minds and hearts were open just enough to notice that "something was up," that a certain star in the sky was the instrument of God. We don't know if they believed in Jesus before this encounter with Jesus, but we do know one thing: they believed in Jesus after this encounter! May you and I believe in Jesus in an even deeper way after encountering Him in the Eucharist.

Someday, we will come before the Lord, like the three wise men did on this solemnity, giving us a chance to see Jesus not in a manger, but in all his glory. What will we have to offer him? What kind of a life? That's a question only you and I can answer. It's a question only I can answer. That gift is constantly being made, like a large quilt or afghan. And each day something new is being added. Hopefully it will be a beautiful gift that we can give to God at the end of our lives. We know that the gift we give God at the end won't be any material thing. It won't be anything we can touch. What it could be is a life of good deeds, a life of regular reception of Jesus and his sacraments, a life of faith. Those are the things we can take with us.

May the three wise men be our inspiration of giving to God the best of our lives and may the Star of Bethlehem be our example of lighting the way to Jesus for others.
