

Shrove Tuesday. In western Christian churches, the day before Lent starts is Shrove Tuesday. This is also known as Pancake Day. This day was traditionally the last chance to use up the foods Christians would not be eating during Lent. Pancakes became associated with Shrove Tuesday as they were a simple meal that could use up all the eggs, fats, and milk in the house with just the addition of flour. Each year women from the town of Olney in Buckinghamshire race through the streets, tossing pancakes in a frying pan. Children from local schools take part in their own races.

the 3rd Sunday of Lent - March 3, 2024

Jesus is giving us a lesson in the gospel, which is to respect the house of God. And, in respecting God's house, there's an all-encompassing motivation at work here, and that is the love of God, which is carried out in the first three commandments given in the book of Exodus today. Jesus took his relationship with the Father seriously, which is why he was so upset when his Father's house was not treated respectfully. Jesus loves the Father.

And there are different ways we can love God this Lenten season. We can receive the sacraments faithfully, including the sacrament of reconciliation. The Lenten Reconciliation Service this year will be Thursday evening, March 14, at 7 p.m. Let's pray for a good turn-out and that many people will come to receive God's gift of mercy.

And the last seven commandments are no less important. They concern love for neighbor. One way we can do that is to bring non-perishable food items for our "pack the pew" food drive. So, during this season of Lent, may God give us a deeper love for the Father and for each other, as temples of God and brothers and sisters in Christ.
