

# Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten



#### the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Lent - February 25, 2024

In the transfiguration account in this weekend's gospel, Jesus is showing us a number of things. First, it shows that he is one with the Father and the Son. Second, it shows that Jesus is divine! Jesus is letting a little of his divine nature, a little of his godliness shine through. Scripture tells us that no one has ever seen God in his completeness and lived.

And whenever we reverence the Blessed Sacrament, we are acknowledging the divinity of Jesus who was transfigured on the mountain that day. And whenever we say, "Amen" when we come up to receive communion, we are making an Act of Faith in Jesus as Divine as well as human. Whenever we pray to Jesus, we are also admitting of His divinity.

A third reason the transfiguration account is preserved in scripture is a reason for us to have hope, to help us keep our eyes fixed on the prize: on Jesus. Yes, He is one like us, but He is also God, our Maker and Savior. Jesus also wants to show us that if we give witness to the Father like Jesus did throughout His life and at His transfiguration, the Father will support us like He did for Jesus when He said, "This is my Son, Listen to Him!"

It is through our dying and rising with Christ each day – by denying ourselves the things that we want to do, and instead doing what God calls us to do, Jesus' transfiguration continues in us today. Here, Jesus calls us to set aside our agendas and to pay attention to the needs of others. Experiences of the Lord's transfiguration help us see beyond the here and now to what will be, to our eternal share in the risen life of Christ.


