Interactive Lent Projects. Please continue to visit the table by the cross before or after Mass and pull out a thorn (or several) from the crown of thorns and take prayer requests off the cross. Your fellow parishioners need prayers said and Jesus needs to be relieved of the pain of the crown of thorns.

Lenten Regulations. Everyone 14 years of age or older is bound to abstain from meat on all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.

Pack the Pew Ends THIS Weekend! We will be sending 2/3 of the food to The Emergency Food Pantry this week. Thank you EVERYONE!!! We will let you know the poundage donated next week.

Palm Sunday, March 24, is the last Sunday of Lent. It signifies Jesus's triumphant return to Jerusalem after spending 40 days and nights in the desert. During Mass, we celebrate his return and our desire to follow him.

At Blessed Sacrament we begin the Palm Sunday service in the Social Hall. After the readings, we process into the Church. We follow Fr. Luiten waving our palms in jubilation, reenacting the excitement of Jesus' time. Please listen to the instructions given by Fr. Luiten prior to the procession. Thank you.

Ring Those Bells! Bring your small hand bells to ring during the singing of the *Gloria* on <u>Holy</u>

Thursday and the <u>Easter Vigil</u>. We have not sung the *Gloria* through the duration of Lent. We ring the bells as we sing it once again and rejoice!

Stations of the Cross. Our last Lenten Stations of the Cross will be Friday, March 22, 7:00 p.m. All are welcome to attend.

Use of Incense: We will be using incense during Mass on Holy Thursday (March 28) and the Easter Vigil (March 30).

Good Friday – Red Easter Vigil – White
Easter Sunday – White
Let's fill the church with the colors of Lent!

Chrism Mass: Tuesday, March 26, 11 a.m., St. Ann & Joachim. All are invited. Bishop Folda will bless the Holy Oils for the upcoming year.

What is the Chrism Mass? During the Chrism Mass, the Oil of the Sick (used during the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick), the Oil of Catechumens (used during the Sacrament of Baptism), and the Chrism oil are consecrated by the Bishop. Large vessels of oil are carried to the altar for the blessings and consecration of Chrism, which is a mixture of oil and balsam. After Mass, the oils are distributed to each parish. The oils are taken back to the parishes and used for the Sacraments.

Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten



the Upcoming Holy Week - March 17, 2024

Though Holy Week doesn't begin until next week, this week is a good time to begin to focus our attention on the greatest week in the church year. This was the week that Jesus began the new covenant in his blood, prophesied by Jeremiah centuries before. In this new covenant, God promises to forgive sin and to restore the relationship between us and God. We know now that the new covenant is fulfilled in Jesus.

The scriptures tell us about the old covenant and how, thousands of years ago, God made a treaty with the Jewish people called a covenant. God made the old covenant first with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, renewed through Moses in Egypt. In Egypt, God promised to save all the first-born Jewish children through the sacrifice of a year-old male unblemished lamb. On that night of the Passover, all first-born children in Egypt would die, except for the children of those houses which had the blood of that unblemished male lamb sprinkled on their doorposts.

In the chaos which ensued, Pharaoh allowed Moses and his fellow slaves – the Israelites, to leave. That evening, all the fist-born children died except for the Israeli children, and all the Israeli people were set free from slavery! The Jewish people still celebrate this great occasion as the most solemn feast of the year, called Passover. Now you understand why they call it Passover, because the angel of death passed over all houses which had the blood of the lamb sprinkled on their doorposts.

And, on a typical Passover meal that the Jews commemorate every year, about 2,000 years ago. Jesus celebrated the Last Supper when he gave his disciples His body and blood. We commemorate that great occasion of Our Lord's supper every Sunday, when he gave the world his life to free and save us, but especially on Holy Thursday. However, the mystery, called the paschal mystery, of what happened on that first Holy Thursday during the Last Supper cannot be seen apart from what happened on the following days, Friday, and Saturday night - called the Easter Vigil. For the Jews, Passover is the most solemn time of the year. For us Christians, The Easter Triduum ("3 days) which occurs during the same time as the Jewish Passover, is the most solemn time of the Church year.

And the highlight of the Church year, even more important than Christmas, is Easter, when we celebrate Jesus' glorious victory over sin and death. The only way for us to get the most out of the different gatherings is to be open and ready for Christ. So may each one of us truly be open to receiving God's strength and presence in the coming Holy Week of the year 2024 – the week after next week and die with Christ to sin so we may rise with him and have an Easter we will never forget!
