





Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten



for the 5th Sunday of Easter - April 28, 2024

The first reading today speaks about the effects of Paul's life-changing decision he made. Just to refresh our memories, Paul had a miraculous conversion on a journey to Damascus. He was knocked to the ground, so strong was his calling. And on this journey, Paul wasn't just travelling down the road to see friends, or to visit family. He was on his way to Damascus to persecute members of the church, to persecute our ancestors in the faith! Little did he realize that one day he would be one of those persecuted Christians. Then Paul made an "about face," in the sense that he turned from being one of the biggest persecutors of the Christians to one of the biggest defenders of the faith. Paul then knew what to do. He knew what his vocation in life would be. Paul realized this because Jesus, in effect, brought Paul to his knees!

Usually, God does not call us that way. God usually speaks softly as to what He wants us to do with the rest of our lives. We come to know what Jesus wants of us for the rest of our lives through prayer. We must "ask Him." And we can ask Him anywhere. We can talk to God in the privacy of our own homes, and even at work or in the silence of our hearts. This is what Jesus meant when he told us in the gospel of John to "remain in Jesus, ... who is the vine, and we are the branches." We also come to know what Jesus wants us to do with the rest of our live through receiving the sacraments such as reconciliation and the Eucharist.

In answering the question, "What does God want me to do today?" This is usually a little easier to answer. Again, it takes prayer and a closer relationship with Jesus. To know what to do each day takes a call to holiness. Some things that God may want you and me to do today are to visit a friend or to talk to someone who is lonely. He may want us to pray, to take a little time out of our busy day for a "me and God" walk. God may be calling us to spend some time with the family, not working, but just having fun. God may want us just to rest.

The bottom line is that when we are in touch with the Lord, then we will do the things that most benefit God, others, and ourselves.
