Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten



the 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time - July 14, 2024

There are a number of things that we can learn from the gospel this weekend. One is that it is much easier to go through life without a lot of unnecessary baggage. The twelve apostles realized this when Jesus sent them out. We can get rid of all the unnecessary spiritual baggage that can burden us, called sin, in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and the small sins through an act of sorrow to God. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is usually fairly popular just before Christmas and just before Easter. That is good. But it is quite a long time between Easter and Christmas, and now is about the midway point between the two seasons, which provides us with a good opportunity to receive the Sacrament of reconciliation. Hopefully

we will seize the opportunity. Once we are reconciled with God, it is much easier to follow in the footsteps of Christ and the apostles. Another part of the message of the gospel isn't just what the apostles preached, but how the apostles lived. We don't know much about the backgrounds of most of the twelve apostles. There are different stories that are spread by word of mouth, but we do know some things about a few of the twelve. They possessed at least two good qualities. We know that four of the twelve apostles were fishermen. Those were Peter, Andrew, James, and John. I have found out something about being a fisherman. All those who fish must possess a certain quality, and that is patience. With prayer and a deep relationship with God, we can develop what the Lord wants from us, which is patience.

Another quality the twelve had which we, too, are called to develop and practice, is obedience. When the apostles were chosen, they were in the process of doing what they liked to do. They were fishing. And the Lord said, "Come, follow Me." And yet, they dropped their nets and they followed Jesus. A quality the twelve had here was obedience. Obedience is one thing we have been taught early on in life, from the time we were little children. Our parents taught us to obey them. And, now that many of us are grown, we are still called to obedience, to obey our primary father who is God.

So, realizing God's great love for us, may we be open to God's work in getting rid of the unnecessary baggage in our lives this summer, so we may more faithfully and patiently and urgently follow in the path of Jesus.


