

Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten



the 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time-Sept. 1, 2024

In this weekend's second reading, James calls us to "act on the word" that has taken root in us. If we only listen to it, we are deceiving ourselves. And so, our actions are very important in our journey to eternal life. There is a saying which goes: "Who we are is God's gift to us. What we become is our gift to God." And we become more like God through what we do, through acting on the Word.

The church teaches that there are good acts, there are morally neutral acts, and there are bad acts. All three are spoken of in the gospel. In the gospel, Jesus is unhappy with the Pharisees because they put so much emphasis on the neutral acts and did not choose the good act of following God with their hearts. Bad acts are all those self-centered choices we make in which refuse God's love.

Today, there is a loss of a sense of these bad actions, called sin, perhaps somewhat out of ignorance. Many people do not think these are wrong anymore. But they are. Not only do the sins offend God, but they are detrimental and harmful to our spirits.

We must also remember there are the good acts which we are called to carry out through regarding God's commandment. And we are called to carry out those good acts through prayer and in the kindness and love we show to others. So, hopefully having listened to the word of God with open hearts, there is something that spoke to us personally. May we act on that word. In this way we are Christians not just in name, but in what we do.




