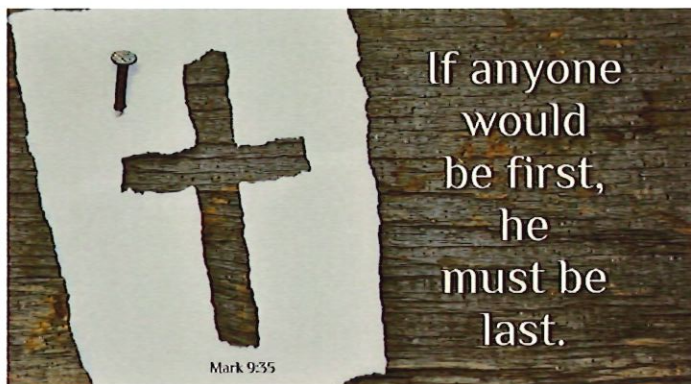

### **Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten**



#### **the 25th Sunday of the Year – Sept. 22, 2024**

The focus of the gospel today is service. Jesus said, "If anyone wishes to rank first, he or she must remain the last one of all and the servant of all." We are called to be servants! Our example as servant is Jesus which was shown in his very act on the cross when, out of obedience to the Father, He died for us to take away our sins and to open heaven for us. Jesus wanted to see to it that we would have a chance to be happy with him forever in heaven!

One who serves actually makes life easier for others. That is what Jesus did for us. The Old Testament Prophet Isaiah speaks about a servant who will suffer on behalf of many. Looking back, we realize that he was really speaking about Jesus!

Notice even when he was on the cross, Jesus was concerned about others. He wasn't all absorbed in his pain and suffering and didn't have self pity. He was concerned about the thief next to him who repented. He told him, "This day you will be with me in paradise." He was concerned about his mother Mary and John. He gave them to each other, to Mary to be his mother and to John to be her son. He was also concerned about those who crucified him when he said, "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do."

We can serve others bodily, such as through being gracious hosts and hostesses when we have visitors at home. We as a parish will have the opportunity to serve others at our Fall dinner and bazaar on the first Sunday in October. We can serve others spiritually through lending an ear to a person who needs to talk or giving words of advice or encouragement. We can also serve them spiritually through our intercessory prayers for one another, among other ways. We should never underestimate the power of prayer. Jesus wants us to pray for one another!

May we continue to serve others and to live not for ourselves. When we do so, it is amazing to see that whatever problems that happened in the past which may have tarnished our reputation begin to fade and can even be forgotten, and Christ begins to shine in us more brightly.

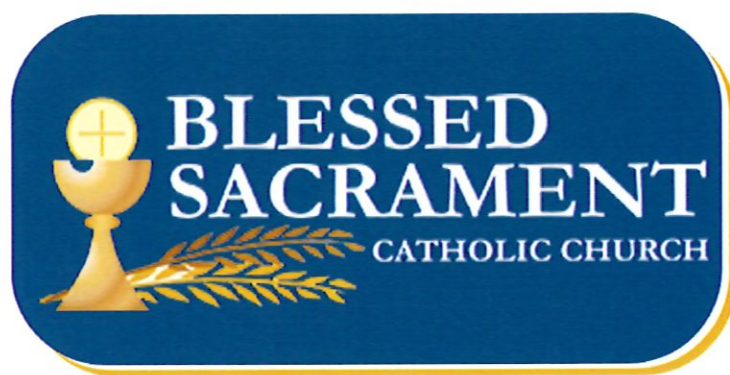

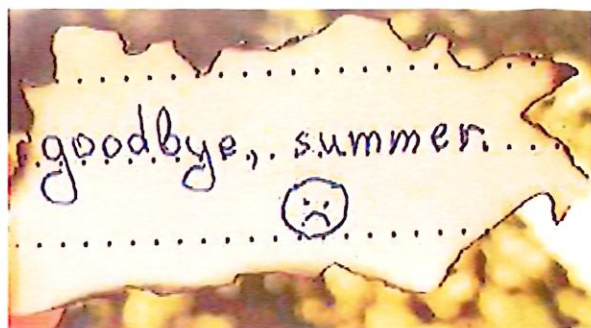

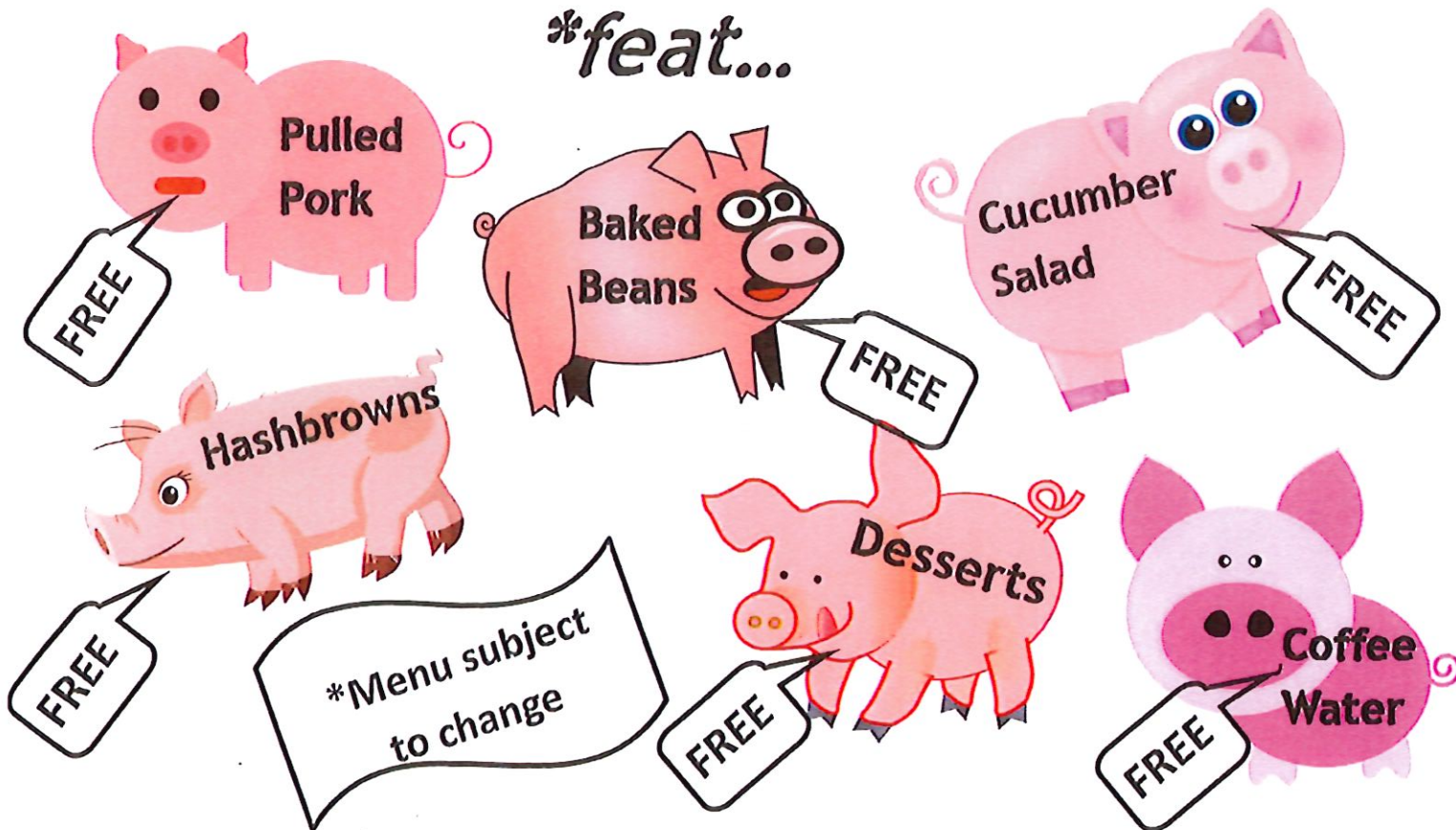
