

Faith Formation This Week:

GROWING OUR FAITH:

We are gearing up for the big Sacraments in 3rd grade, talking about Jesus and how he is with us, helping us, guiding us, and loving us. Also they got a tour of the church and learned about different things that we see in the church with a scavenger hunt. These things included the Sanctuary Lamp, Tabernacle, Altar, Baptismal Font, and even the stain glass windows! Also we are working on our Bible Verse lookup skills by looking up different passages in the bible together.

We focused on knowing God through all that he has created and through human reason. We also talked about the truths God has revealed to us, navigating how we can use sacred scripture to seek God's truths. This month we will be focusing the Bible. Starting out with "Bible 101" talking about how it is organized, how it was written and then covering the points from our book...

Explain divine inspiration as God's direction and guidance of the human writers of scripture.

Recognize that God's "voice" in the proclamation of Scripture and our response comprise a dialogue.

Discover the literal sense and the spiritual sense of scripture.

Identify the development of the Gospels from the person of Jesus to the written word.

Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten



Reflections on the Gospel for the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time October 27th, 2024

If you listen closely to the gospel, there are probably as many different helps that one can get from the gospel as there are people here today. The beauty of scripture is that it was written for all of us the Body of Christ, and it was written for each one of us as individuals. If someone asked you to put yourself in the place of one of the people in the gospel story, who would it be?

Perhaps you might say, "I relate best to Bartimaeus. I understand where he is coming from." Though I don't know of anyone in the parish who is completely blind, we all have handicaps. And sometimes we have the desire to cry out like Bartimaeus did, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me!" Another way of saying this would be, "Jesus, Son of David, help me!" This is a beautiful prayer.

When you sit back and listen to this narrative in the gospel, you might picture yourself as one of the crowd, telling Bartimaeus to be quiet, and not to come to Jesus. You might agree with the crowd who believe that Jesus doesn't want to be bothered by someone as insignificant as you or me. If we see ourselves as part of the crowd in the gospel today, on the one hand, this is not a good thing. But we also should give the crowd some credit. We might say that the crowd "redeemed themselves" when finally they called the blind man to come to Jesus after Jesus told them to call him.

There might be people here today when, after hearing the gospel passage today, see themselves in Jesus' shoes. I can imagine those doctors, nurses, and EMT's who can relate to Jesus who healed this man. After all, it is their job to work at restoring health to the sick.

And now back to Bartimaeus. Finally, for the serious Christian, Jesus asks each one of us the same question that He asked the blind man, "What do you want me to do for you?" That is a good question for us to ponder. What do we want Jesus to do for us? Perhaps we can think about that question and give the Lord an answer.

What is the origin of All Saints Day?



The feast that we know of today as "All Saints Day" originated in May 609, when Pope Boniface IV dedicated the Pantheon in Rome to the Blessed Virgin Mary. In the eighth century, Pope Gregory III changed the date to November 1 when he dedicated a chapel at the Vatican in honor of all the saints, and Pope Gregory IV later extended this celebration of all saints to the universal church.
