



Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten



the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time
November 17, 2024

The readings today speak about something that makes most people sit up and take note: the end of the world and the second coming of Jesus. The first reading today is quite different than the rest of the Old Testament. It was written not too long before the coming of Jesus, and it is different than the rest of the Old Testament when Daniel says, "Many of those who sleep in the dust of death shall awake." What does he mean by "sleeping in the dust of death?" The Church takes this verse to mean the resurrection of the dead.

Daniel tells us that it will be a very important event, but it is really a hopeful reading. The prophet gives us reason to hope when he says, "Some shall live forever: the wise shall shine brightly. At that time, your people will escape, everyone who is found written in the book." This is the book in which God has written the names of all the faithful. You can rest assured that our names have been written in that book. God has called us to be with Him forever in heaven. However, we can forfeit that calling because of unrepentant sin.

This idea of the resurrection of the dead from Daniel fits in well with the gospel today, because Jesus is talking about his second coming. He says that when He comes again, there will be a resurrection of the dead, which we all hope to be a part of.

We have a lot to gain from these readings. First, trusting in God's blessings is one lesson we can learn. Second, we must be spiritually prepared for Jesus' coming again. Economically and financially, this preparedness is not all that important, but spiritual preparedness is what Jesus calls for us. Jesus says, "Heaven and earth will pass away, but by words will not pass away." And third, no one knows when Jesus will come again. "But of that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father."

Personally, I'm glad that I do not know when my last day on earth will be. This way, it encourages us to follow Christ/be vigilant every day, not just the last day of our lives. May you and I remain close to Jesus so we may be prepared when He comes again.


