Advent

The Advent Wreath and Candles.

The Advent Wreath is one of the most symbolic traditions for the season of Advent. With its colorful candles lit on each of the four weeks of Advent. Many families and individuals have an Advent wreath at home and observe the tradition of lighting the candles for each Sunday.

The <u>Four Candles</u> represent Jesus coming as the light in darkness. Each week, an additional candle is lit to symbolize the increasing anticipation and preparation for the arrival of Jesus. The light from the candles represents the light of Christ coming into the world. Each of the candles lit represents an aspect of preparation during the season of Advent.

The First Week of Advent.

The First Candle Represents: Hope

The candle of hope assures us we can have hope that God will fulfill the prophecies declared in the Old Testament about Jesus. Hope doesn't disappoint us.

Candle Color: Purple

Purple is the primary color associated with Advent. It symbolizes penance, preparation, and sacrifice. During the first week of Advent, we remember the Old Testament prophets who foretold of Jesus' coming with hope and anticipation.



Advent Information in the Gathering Area To help us prepare for the Advent Season, we have assembled some informational pamphlets. There is also a booklet with Advent Mass Readings and Daily Meditations. These are in the Media Rack in the Gathering Area.

Fill the Manger with Straw. On the Sanctuary is placed an empty crib in anticipation of Jesus' coming. As a parish family let's come together to fill that crib with straw of "goodness" during the Advent season. It doesn't matter if you are 2 or 90 years old -let's make that bed for Jesus. For every good deed, act of kindness, patience, understanding, forgiveness, resisting judgement on another, etc. place a piece of straw in the crib. Do this as a family or on your own; before or after mass; during the week when church is open. By the time Christmas Eve comes we will have the best bed ever for baby Jesus.

CATHOLIC CALISTHENICS: Gestures, Postures and Symbolic Movements used in the Mass – Part 1

The Sign of the Cross: The most often used Catholic sign is crossing oneself. It is, in itself, a full and complete prayer. The sign of the cross is made by touching the hand to the forehead using the Trinitarian formula (*In the name of the Father*) the sternum, (*and the Son*) left shoulder (*and the Holy*) and the right shoulder (*Spirit*). According to the rubrics, congregants cross themselves:

- 1. At the beginning of the Mass
- 2. At the Rite of Sprinkling (Asperges)
- 3. When the celebrant says, "May Almighty God have mercy ..." immediately prior to the First Reading.
- 4. Upon receiving Holy Communion
- 5. At the conclusion of the Mass. However, rubrics aside, there are additional times one may cross oneself at Mass:
- Upon entering/leaving the church (using holy water)
- 7. Upon entering/leaving a pew
- 8. When crossing the church and happening upon the Blessed Sacrament/tabernacle
- 9. Whenever the celebrant passes during the entering/exiting processions
- Whenever the celebrant gives a blessing at Mass
- Before and after saying private prayer before and after Mass including personal devotions

(e.g., the Rosary) and fulfilling the requirements of one's penance.

In addition, you may "put on the armor of God" (Ephesians 6:11) by crossing yourself each time your mind wanders, or a passing thought causes you to momentarily forget the reason you're at Mass.

Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten



the 1st Sunday of Advent - December 1, 2024

Advent is the first season of the church year, symbolizing the freshness of new beginnings. Society kind of skips over this season and jumps right into Christmas. It is too bad society doesn't celebrate Advent because Advent is indeed a very special time of the church year. Our hearts are what is important during this season of the Church year. We are called to ready our hearts. Ready our hearts for what, you may ask?

We are called to ready our hearts For Christmas and for when Jesus comes again. And when he comes again, he will come in glory, and everyone will know about it! It is important for us to be ready. It's kind of like a player in a baseball game. They stand in the left field, waiting for a fly ball. And when that ball comes, if they are not ready, it could cost them the game! If he or she is a professional, it could cost them their career. The exception to this comparison is that our spiritual lives are much more important than a game because they deal with our eternal salvation. Jesus does not want us to be sleeping on the job. He wants us awake and vigilant when he comes.

Jesus and the church have given us some concrete ways in which we can prepare for Christmas and the coming of Christ. Jesus in the gospel calls us to pray constantly for the strength to stand secure. Also, we are called to be vigilant, guarding against worldly cares such as overindulgence in things. We can receive the sacraments such as the eucharist and reconciliation often. We will have our Advent reconciliation service Thursday December 12 at 7 p.m.

During the coming weeks let us make that extra effort to embrace that spiritual attitude so the Season of Advent may become something special for us. May Advent be a true moment of preparation for each of us in the joyful expectation, in the hope

of the coming of Jesus at Christmas at our death and at Our Lord's second and final coming.

Since this is the first bulletin of the month, I have another item for you.

Advent. Advent can be a great time for us to come to the Lord, whether it be at Mass or in the sacrament of reconciliation, in our daily prayers, or in the acts of charity that we show to others, including the poor. I encourage each of us to take an ornament from the MinisTREE in the gathering area, purchase the gift written on the ornament, and bring it back to the tree by December 18. These gifts will go to help the people at Churches United for the Homeless. In this way, we are truly living out the spirit of Advent. Wearing the color for the season, which is purple, to Mass is also a great way to live in the spirit of the season. The third Sunday of Advent is pink or rose. There is also a manger in the sanctuary where the baby Jesus will rest at Christmas. The manger needs straw! So, when you do a good deed this Advent, take some straw from the bale and place it in the manger.

May God gently lead us and guide us as we prepare for the awesome celebration of the birth of our savior.
