




Candle Color: Purple



**CATHOLIC CALISTHENICS:** Gestures, Postures and Symbolic Movements used in the Mass – Part 4

#### Striking the Breast

- One strikes at one's breast three times during the Confiteor ("Through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault.")
- In reciting the Agnus Dei ("Lamb of God"), we should strike the breast at the words "Have mercy on us."

#### Kneeling

- The word "kneeling" (Greek: proskynein) occurs 59 times in the New Testament — 24 in the Book of Revelation which represents the heavenly standard by which our earthly Mass is based.
- We kneel after the Agnus Dei ("Lamb of God").
   Those who can't kneel should make a profound bow when the celebrant genuflects after the consecration.
- Kneel during the Eucharistic Prayer.
- Kneel in prayer when you return to your pew after Communion, until the priest sits down, or until he says, "Let us pray."

#### Sitting

- We sit at the First and Second readings and the responsorial Psalm before the Gospel.
- We sit during the homily. We sit during the Preparation of the Gifts at the Offertory.

#### Standing

We stand for the:

- Entrance procession
- Rite of Sprinkling (Asperges)
- Creed
- Alleluia chant before the Gospel.
- While the Gospel is proclaimed
- · during the Prayer of the Faithful.
- We stand as the celebrant says, "Pray brethren that our sacrifice..." and remain standing to respond, "May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands ..."

- The Lord's Prayer
- The congregation remains standing until the end of the Sanctus ("Holy, holy").
- Stand for the concluding prayers.
- Remain standing until all ministers have processed out.

## Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten



### the 4th Sunday of Advent - December 22, 2024

The person of focus in the gospel today is Mary. Elizabeth realized what a special person Mary was and is when she proclaimed, "Who am I that the mother of my Lord should come to me?" What profound respect we owe Mary, the Mother of God, the one who gave the world its savior. And, having experienced God's presence through the angel Gabriel, this experience called forth from Mary a response. Mary just didn't get on a camel or mosey over on a horse or walk over to see her cousin, she "went in haste" to visit her cousin Elizabeth. She couldn't wait to tell Elizabeth the good news!

Like Mary, Elizabeth, and John's encounter with the Lord in Elizabeth's womb, our encounter with Jesus in Word and Sacrament, in one another in creation is also meant to call forth a response. We, like Mary, Elizabeth, and John the Baptist, upon encountering the Lord, are called to do the Father's will. And what is God's will for us? To obey God by loving the Lord and others. Just think what life would be like if no one did the Father's will by not living with a spirit of charity! There would be even more chaos, fighting, and anger.

The world says that obedience to God will not get us anywhere. But the truth of the matter is that we benefit when we obey God despite the seeming outcome, no matter what the world says. Isaiah describes in his book what God wants for the world: a world where everything is in harmony, where the "lion will lie down with the lamb." So, God's will is for us to live in harmony and love with each other and with the whole of creation. And that will get us eternal life.

So, when the Lord comes again, may he find us obediently serving Him, not seeking so much our own ends, but may he see our unselfish acts of loving and serving Him in our lives as Mary our Mother did, by touching the world with the presence of Christ in her life.


