The Second Week of Advent

The Second Candle Represents: Peace

Candle Color: Purple

This candle signifies Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem. It also symbolizes the peace that Jesus Christ brings to the world.

Advent Liturgical Traditions and Celebrations

To balance the two elements of remembrance and anticipation, the first two Sundays in Advent look forward to Christ's second coming, and the last two Sundays look backward to remember Christ's first coming. Over the course of the four weeks, Scripture readings move from passages about Christ's return in judgment to Old Testament passages about the expectation of the coming Messiah to New Testament passages about the announcements of Christ's arrival by John the Baptist and the Angels.



Fill the Manger with Straw. On the Sanctuary is placed an empty crib in anticipation of Jesus' coming. As a parish family let's come together to fill that crib with straw of "goodness" during the Advent season. It doesn't matter if you are 2 or 90 years old -let's make that bed for Jesus. For every good deed, act of kindness, patience, understanding, forgiveness, resisting judgement on another, etc. place a piece of straw in the crib. Do this as a family or on your own; before or after mass; during the week when church is open. By the time Christmas Eve comes we will have the best bed ever for baby Jesus.

Gospel Greeting

Upon hearing the name of the Gospel that is about to be read at Mass, the faithful use the ancient form of crossing themselves with three small crosses (Latin: *tres cruces*) using the thumb upon the forehead, the lips and over the heart. You may wish to add the following silent prayer when doing so:

"May the Lord be on my mind, on my lips and in my heart."

Genuflection

We show respect and reverence to the Blessed Sacrament by facing the tabernacle and bending our right knee to the floor.

- We genuflect on coming and leaving the church and when we enter or leave our pew.
- There's no need to genuflect when leaving the pew to receive Communion.

Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten



the 2nd Sunday of Advent – December 8, 2024

Today's gospel speaks about salvation. The gospel quotes Isaiah who stated that "all flesh will see the 'salvation' of God." Much more is promised here than just being saved from something but is involves being saved by and for someone and something much greater than this world. We are saved not just from something, but by God, and for eternal life.

And John calls us to prepare for that salvation. When we think about it, we have reason to prepare with a spirit of joy. After all, Jesus did a lot for us. Among many other things, He humbled himself to be born in a smelly stable and allowed Himself to be laid in a manger. Jesus truly emptied Himself by becoming one of us, taking on our limited human nature. And therefore, it is only right for us to give our whole lives back to God in return for what He did for us. Realizing that what we do for others during this Advent season, we really do for Christ is cause for a spirit of joy!

May we be ready for the coming day of the Lord, when all evil, sin, pain, and suffering will be done away with, when, by the grace of God and our cooperation with that Grace, we will be with God, the angels, and the saints, enjoying that eternal reunion with Christ, not at Christmas, but in Heaven, in eternal life.

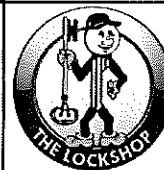
