Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten

2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time -January 19, 2025

In today's gospel, Jesus performs a miracle. This is the first miracle of his public ministry. The reason Jesus performed these miracles was to get us to believe, to point us to the Father. Jesus' miracles cured people, forgave sin, and made people happy, as in the case of today's miracle in Cana. It was an unusual miracle. Here, Jesus didn't cure anyone, nor cast out an evil spirit, nor forgave sin. He just wanted people to continue the celebration. We see today the happiness God brings to people through many and varied miracles, such as the gift of a brand-new baby!

The Church teaches us that in this miracle, Jesus has sanctified marriage, and thus we have the sacrament of marriage in the Church today. This miracle shows us that Jesus loves it when people are happy, He doesn't enjoy seeing people suffer.

The miracle of the wedding at Cana reminds us also that events in peoples' lives do not always go perfect. Jesus is here to help the daily events run as smoothly as possible, whether it be our jobs, the daily work around the home, or travelling. He has really come to give us peace and happiness. However, it is not the temporary happiness which so many people strive for which God gives, but a happiness which will last forever, a peace which rests in Jesus himself.

Jesus also points us towards the Eucharist in the changing of water into wine. In the Eucharist, Jesus does something even better. He changes wine into his body and blood! May Christ who comes to us in the Eucharist, help us each day, and make life much more enjoyable for us all. May we be aware of the miracles that happen each day in our lives, not only the big miracles, but the little ones as well.

Jubilee 2025 is being celebrated in the Diocese of Fargo until December 28, 2025. The theme is "Pilgrims of Hope." The official website of the jubilee Year is www.jubilaum2025.va.



On May 9, 2024, Pope Francis solemnly proclaimed the upcoming Jubilee Year 2025, when he promulgated the *Bull of Indiction "Spes non confundit"* ("Hope does not disappoint").

Jubilee Sites in the Diocese of Fargo

Bishop Folda has designated the following churches and sanctuaries as locations in the Diocese of Fargo where the Jubilee Year Indulgence can be received during the local observance of the Jubilee of 2025, that is, **December 29, 2024–December 28, 2025:**

- St. Mary's Cathedral, Fargo
- Our Lady of Guadalupe Adoration Chapel, Fargo
- Maryvale Retreat Center, Valley City
- St. Therese the Little Flower Church, Rugby
- The Basilica of St. James, Jamestown
- Carmel of Mary, Wahpeton
- St. Michael's Church, Grand Forks

The Jubilee Year Grace

Pope Francis grants the Jubilee Indulgence to those who visit one of these designated sacred places, who are truly repentant and free from any affection for sin, who are moved by a spirit of

charity, and who, purified through the sacrament of Penance and refreshed by Holy Communion, pray for the intention of the Holy Father. The indulgence may be applied in suffrage to the souls in Purgatory.

The visit must in the form of (1) a pilgrimage, or (2) a pious visit:

1. **Pilgrimage:** the faithful, as "pilgrims of hope," make a pilgrimage to one of the locations, understanding the significance of pilgrimage, that is, manifesting the great need for conversion and reconciliation. It is recommended that sections of Pope Francis' Bull of Indiction be prayerfully read as preparation for a pilgrimage or as an integral part of the pilgrimage itself.
2. **Pious Visit:** individually or in a group, devoutly visit for a suitable period of time, engage in Eucharistic adoration and meditation, concluding with the Our Father, the Profession of Faith in any legitimate form, and invocations to Mary, the Mother of God (such as the "Hail Mary").

The Jubilee Indulgence can also be gained by those who perform a work of mercy. It is also available for those who are home-bound or imprisoned. For more information on the Jubilee Indulgence see the attached document.

Jubilee 2025

Pilgrims of Hope

"Now the time has come for a new Jubilee, when once more the Holy Door will be flung open to invite everyone to an intense experience of the love of God." – Pope Francis

The Apostolic Penitentiary began its Decree granting the Jubilee Year Indulgence, by stating: "the Holy Father calls on all Christians to become *pilgrims of hope*. This is a virtue which must be sourced above all in the grace of God and in the fullness of His mercy. It is to be rediscovered in the signs of the times, which, encompassing 'the yearning of human hearts in need of God's saving presence, ought to become signs of hope'" (quoting Pope Francis). It went on to say that the Jubilee Year Indulgence "acquired an even more important meaning" in the context of the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy (in 2016), "since God's mercy becomes the 'indulgence on the part of the Father who, through the Bride of Christ, his Church, reaches the pardoned sinner and frees him or her from every residue left by the consequences of sin'. Similarly, now the Holy Father declares that the gift of the Indulgence 'is a way of discovering the unlimited nature of God's mercy.'"

The conditions for the obtaining of the Jubilee Indulgence:

All the faithful, who are ...

- truly repentant and free from any affection for sin,
- moved by a spirit of charity,
- purified through the Sacrament of Penance,
- refreshed by Holy Communion,
- and who pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff,

... will be able to obtain from the treasury of the Church a plenary indulgence, with remission and forgiveness of all their sins, which can be applied in suffrage to the souls in Purgatory.

Jubilee Year Indulgence

Below are the ways the faithful can gain the Jubilee Indulgence throughout the Holy Year:
Dec. 24, 2024–Jan. 6, 2026 in Rome; Dec. 29, 2024–Dec. 28, 2025 in the Diocese of Fargo.

I. Undertake a Pilgrimage

Make a pilgrimage to a major basilica in Rome, or other designated basilicas or shrines around the world, such as a Jubilee Pilgrimage Site in the Diocese of Fargo Jubilee (listed on other side).

While there, participate in Holy Mass, a celebration of the Word of God, the Liturgy of the Hours, the Way of the Cross, the Marian Rosary, or a Penitential Celebration with individual confession.

II. Make a Pious Visit

Visit any Jubilee site in the world, including a Jubilee Pilgrimage Site in the Diocese of Fargo. While there, engage in Eucharistic Adoration and meditation, concluding with the Our Father, the Profession of Faith (the creed), and invocations to Mary, the Mother of God (such as the Hail Mary, Hail Holy Queen, *Memorare*, etc.).

For the faithful who cannot participate, such as **the elderly, the sick, or those imprisoned** (or those who care for them in hospitals or other care facilities): offer up your sufferings or the hardships of your lives in a spirit of union with the faithful making pilgrimages or pious visits in person, and recite the Our Father, the Profession of Faith (the creed), and a prayer expressive of the Holy Year.

III. Perform a Work of Mercy or Penance

Visit someone in need or in difficulty, making a pilgrimage to Christ present in them.

- **Corporal Works of Mercy:** feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, welcome the stranger, heal the sick, visit the imprisoned, bury the dead.
- **Spiritual Works of Mercy:** counsel the doubtful, instruct the ignorant, admonish sinners, comfort the afflicted, forgive offenses, bear patiently with those who do us ill, pray for the living and dead.

Jubilee Year Bonus! Normally only one plenary indulgence may be gained each day. However, during the Jubilee Year you can receive a second plenary indulgence on behalf of the souls in Purgatory by carrying out an act of charity. Since you need to receive Holy Communion for each plenary indulgence, you must receive Communion a second time the same day in the context of Mass.

Rediscover the penitential nature of Friday

- Abstain the day from futile distractions; including virtual distractions, such as social media and networks.
- Abstain the day from superfluous consumption, and donate a proportionate sum of money to the poor.

Support religious or social works

- Defend and protect life in all its phases.
- Support abandoned children, young people in difficulty, the needy or lonely or elderly, or migrants.
- Dedicate free time to serve the community.
