

Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten

the Solemnity of the Presentation Sunday, February 2, 2025

The lesson in the Presentation is found in the deeds and words of two obscure people that we really know nothing about: the prophet Simeon and the prophetess Anna. They are both examples of hope and patience for the Lord's coming. Hopefully they, too, will inspire us to be patient and faithful in our longing to see the Lord face to face someday.

Simeon tells us something of who Jesus is, when we hear his words: "My eyes have seen your salvation, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel." It is a great image for Jesus: the light, because light scatters darkness. And spiritual darkness what sin is. Sin leaves one in the dark. The church teaches that we cannot get to heaven if we leave this life attached to the darkness of sin. So, attachment to sin results in missing out on Jesus here on earth, and in heaven. The flip side of the coin is that, when our sins are forgiven, we are freed from sin and are guaranteed seeing Jesus, the light of life, in heaven! Jesus, at his Presentation, gave Simeon and Anna hope. And their hope gives us reason to hope!

And, in hearing the gospel along with the first reading from Malachi, we realize that we can even have hope in our trials! Malachi reminds us why sometimes we endure physical, emotional, or spiritual trials. Malachi tells us that God is refining and purifying us. Besides, I know for me, when I am in pain, it is really easy to pray. That's about all I can do.

On this day, when we see so much evil and disaster: division and unrest throughout the world, and even within our own borders, may you and I bring the hope of Christ to others, encouraging them to remain strong in their Catholic faith, so that one day they and we may see the light, Jesus himself, face to face, like Simeon and Anna did. Only unlike the view of Jesus that they had in today's gospel account, we will see Jesus as glorified, shining brightly in eternal life.

Preparing for Lent 2025

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday – March 5.

Collecting Palms: If you have old palms you wish to get rid of; please bring them back to church. The palms are blessed and need to be burned. The ashes are then stored in clean containers and used for future Ash Wednesdays. The palms can be placed in the marked box by the parish office. Please remove plastic bags, paper clips, ribbon, etc., before placing palms in the box.

Do you need prayers? We all need prayers. Maybe for healing, acceptance, patience, understanding, forgiveness, and on and on. Let's take the opportunity to pray for one another during Lent. You can fill out a piece of paper weekly to be placed on the cross in the gathering area. Then each weekend take a prayer or two or more from the cross and pray for the need written. Don't just pray for that one week, pray all through Lent. But don't stop there, keep taking new prayer requests and add them to your prayers. And don't forget to add your own prayers for others to pray.

It precedes Easter and is a solemn period centered on prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

There is no better time to reconnect with or deepen one's faith than Lent. During this time, we can draw closer to God as we prepare for the joyous celebration of Christ's resurrection at Easter.

Jubilee Year of 2025

Holy Door

From a symbolic viewpoint, the Holy Door takes on a special significance: it is the most powerful sign of the



Jubilee since the ultimate aim of the pilgrim is to pass through it. The opening of the door by the Pope constitutes the official beginning of the Holy Year. Originally, there was only one door, at the Basilica of St. John Lateran, which is the cathedral of the Bishop of Rome. Later, to allow as many pilgrims as possible to take part in the Jubilee experience, the other Roman Basilicas also opened their own holy doors.

In crossing the threshold of the Holy Door, the pilgrim is reminded of the passage from chapter 10 of St John's gospel: "I am the door. If anyone enters by me, he will be saved and will go in and out and find pasture." Passing through the Holy Door expresses the decision to follow and be guided by Jesus, who is the Good Shepherd. The door is a passageway that ushers the pilgrim into the interior of a church. For the Christian community, a church is not only a sacred space, to be approached with respect, with appropriate behavior and dress code, but it is a symbol of the communion that binds every believer to Christ: it is a place of encounter and dialogue, of reconciliation and peace which awaits every pilgrim, the Church is essentially the place of the community of the faithful.

In Rome, this experience takes on a special significance because of the special links between the Eternal City and Saints Peter and Paul, the apostles who founded the Christian community in Rome and whose teachings and example are models for the universal Church. The tombs of Saints Peter and Paul are in Rome, they were martyred here; and together with the catacombs, these sacred sites are places of continuous spiritual inspiration.


