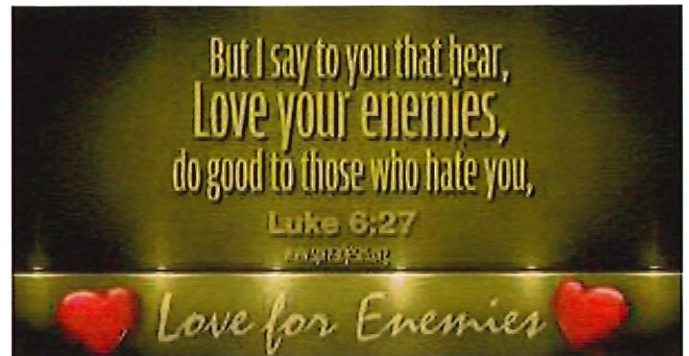

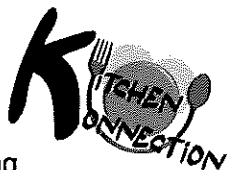

Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten

The 7th Sunday in Ordinary Time – Feb. 23, 2025

The readings this weekend speak about love. In the gospel, we are called to love everyone, even those who mistreat us. It is quite a challenge for us, to love our enemies. Yet, this is part of what Christianity is all about. Christ has called us to a perfection in holiness, which involves loving others, and to be merciful to others. This, we know, is not always so easy. Christ didn't say it would be easy. On the other hand, the Christian life is not without its rewards.

When someone really rubs us the wrong way, it is so easy to lunge out at them verbally, to try to "get even." But there is no merit in that. It is easy to love those who love us, but what's so challenging about that? There is no merit in that, either.

Here is something we can try, to see if we really love our enemy. Think of the person in our lives we can't stand the person we get along with the least. Now, this evening, before you go to bed, try to pray for that person, that God would bless him or her. It might be a tough thing to do, but chances are this person needs our prayers more than anyone else we know. If no one prays for their enemies, how can the grace of God touch their hearts and transform them into friends?

Think of a child. If a hungry child came to our door and asked for a sandwich, would we give it to him or her? Now if an unshaved and dirty traveler came to our door and asked for a sandwich, how would we treat him or her? Would it be different than the way we would treat a child? Yet, is the Spirit of Christ not dwelling in both of them?

We hear a lot of "do nots" in the gospel today. So, what does Jesus tell us to do besides loving our enemy? Jesus wants us to forgive others. For many of us, it is one of the hardest things to do, to forgive others for past problems. Life is too short for us to go around carrying grudges. And God will give us the grace to forgive others, and at times to forgive ourselves for the wrongs we have done in the past.

And Jesus calls us to be compassionate! Compassion means to "suffer with." We are called to identify with people's suffering, whether it be spiritual, through their difficult times. Then, hopefully when we undergo difficult times, people will be there to help us.

May we, with open hearts, receive the love God has to offer us, each day of our lives, a love which comes from God, and through the Sacraments, through prayer, and through one another. And may we have the courage to share that with others, including our enemies.

Stations of the Cross during Lent we will recite and reflect on the Stations of the Cross, every Friday at 7:00 p.m. Everyone is welcome to join us.

What are the Stations of the Cross? Stations of the Cross are representations of the path Jesus took on his way to be crucified. Jesus endured suffering, insults, and moments of support. 'Stations' relays the intense sacrifice that Jesus undertook for human salvation. Blessed Sacrament has 14-Stations of the Cross plaques on the walls of the church.

- Jesus is condemned.
- Jesus takes up his cross.
- Jesus falls the first time.
- Jesus meets Mary.
- Simon helps carry the cross.
- Veronica consoles Jesus.
- Jesus falls a second time.
- Jesus consoles the women.
- Jesus falls a third time.
- Jesus is stripped of his garments.
- Jesus is nailed to the cross.
- Jesus dies.
- Jesus is taken down from the cross.
- Jesus is placed in a tomb.

On Friday's, during Lent, Blessed Sacrament parishioners reflect and pray the Stations of the Cross. If you have never experienced the Stations of the Cross, please join us this year.

Almsgiving. In all the excitement over fasting and giving things up, almsgiving is often forgotten. Yet almsgiving is a crucial work of charity that we Christians are called to participate in. Jesus praised the poor widow who gave "all she had" to the temple treasury (Luke 21:1-4). St. James reminded us that faith must go hand-in-hand with good works, such as care for the poor:

Lent is an important time for almsgiving, and each of us must give according to our situation. Almsgiving is not the tithing you're already doing - it's giving above and beyond what you normally give.

When we give alms, we are supposed to give not merely from our "plenty," but enough to make it hurt—or at least pinch.

When it comes to monetary gifts, *we do have to be cautious about where our funds go.* For those who can't give money, we can seek to give our talent, or our time (become a choir member, volunteer at church)

In summary: Pray about what alms you can give and to who. Discuss it with Jesus. "Each one must do as he has made up his mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:7).

Give it some thought and write down your commitment.

Jubilee Year of 2025



Liturgy

The liturgy is the public prayer of the Church: in the words of the Second Vatican Council, it is the "summit toward which the activity of the Church is directed; [and,] at the same time it is the font from which all her power flows." (Sacrosanctum Concilium, 10). At the center is the Christian liturgy is the Mass - the Eucharistic celebration, where the Body and Blood of Christ are truly received. As a pilgrim, Christ himself walks alongside the disciples and reveals to them the mysteries of the Father, so that they too can say, like the disciples on the road to Emmaus, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening and the day is almost over." (Luke 24:29).

One liturgical rite that is specific to the Jubilee year is the opening of the Holy Door. Until the last century, the Pope would symbolically initiate the demolition of the wall that kept the Holy Door bricked up on non-Jubilee years. Masons would then fully remove the brick wall to be able to open the Holy Door. Since 1950, the ceremony has changed and now the wall is dismantled beforehand and, within a solemn choral liturgy, the Pope pushes open the door from the outside, passing through it as the first pilgrim. This and the other liturgical expressions that accompany the Holy Year emphasize that the Jubilee pilgrimage is not merely an intimate, personal gesture, but is a sign of the journey of the whole people of God toward the Kingdom.

Prayer Ideas

Kids/Teen Prayer Ideas

- Pray on the way to school.
- Pick a relative each day and pray for that person.
- Call a grandparent after church and discuss the homily.
- Go to bed five minutes early and spend extra time talking with God.
- Pay special attention to the intercessions at Mass and choose one to pray for during the week.
- Go to confession.
- Research organizations that support Catholic youth. Get involved.

Adult Prayer Ideas

- Subscribe to a daily prayer newsletter.
- Each day, randomly pray for someone in your phone contact list.
- Spend a few minutes with Scripture each day.
- Start the *Bible in Year* podcast with Fr. Mike Schmitz.
- Attend daily Mass once a week.
- Attend or pray the *Stations of the Cross* every Friday.
- Attend Adoration of the Eucharist.
- Go to confession.

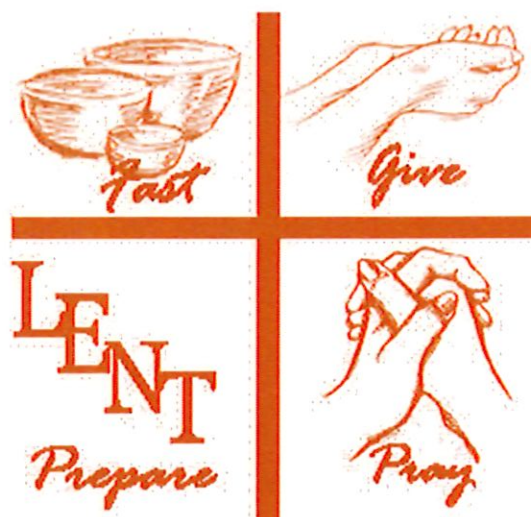
Fasting Ideas

Kids / Teen Fasting Ideas

- Give up a favorite toy or game.
- Fast from social media for a day.
- Give up a favorite snack.
- Drink only water at school.
- Give up a favorite chair at home or seat at school.
- Go without headphones/air pods for a day.

General Sacrifices for all

- Give up coffee.
- Give up alcohol.
- Give up certain social media sites or limit them to certain days/time of day.
- Give up electronics after a certain time in the day (i.e., no screens after 8 p.m.).
- Sleep without a pillow.
- Wake up without hitting the snooze button.
- Shower without hot (with only lukewarm) water.
- Park in the back of the parking lot and say a prayer as you walk to the store.



Almsgiving

- Spend time volunteering as a family.
- Let your child place money in the basket during the offertory at Mass.
- Introduce your family to a charity, determine how and why to donate to it.
- As a family, each of you identify an item (clothing, toy, etc.) and donate it. Discuss that this donation can be a blessing to someone in need.
