Lent | Prayer, Fasting, Almsgiving

Ash Wednesday - March 5 Mass Times: 9:00 a.m. & 7:00 p.m.

What is Ash Wednesday? Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent and is a day of prayer, fasting, and repentance. The name "Ash Wednesday" is from the practice of placing ashes on our foreheads in the shape of a cross. The ashes are obtained by burning the dried palms blessed on the previous year's Palm Sunday.

Lenten Regulations

- Everyone 14 years of age or older is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.
- Everyone 18 or older, and under 59 years of age, is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted.

When health or ability to work is seriously affected, the law does not oblige. Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.

Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten

the 8th Sunday in Ordinary Time - March 2, 2025

The readings today are about speaking. Sirach says, "When a sieve is shaken, the husks appear; so do a man's faults when he speaks." And Jesus in the gospel says "Each man speaks from his heart's abundance." What a person says really tells a lot about who they really are. A person's speech conveys knowledge and love, or lack of love.

Knowledge is a good thing. We spend many years out of our lives learning. I spent twenty years in school. We spend time learning about the truth. The truth is something that people love to know about. And God has given us the scriptures to understand and to come to know the truth. And it is good to know the scriptures and read them, because they give us insight into the mind of the one who created us and who saved us. So, if we truly want to love God, then we need to come to know Him in the scriptures and in the Holy Meal which we receive at Mass. Our young people come to know him through the help of their parents, who teach them about God and teach them to how to pray.

As I mentioned that a person's speech conveys knowledge, our speech also conveys love or lack thereof. Our speech can and should convey love. That is one reason why Jesus attracted so many people: He spoke the truth, but He also spoke from his heart, He spoke with love. He really cared for the people. He was willing to spend time with them, to heal them, and to even die for them. That is what people will be attracted to: the Love of God shining in our hearts. With the love of God in our hearts, and a knowledge of the Gospel, we can be like the good trees which Jesus speaks about in the gospel. Those good trees will bear good fruit, unlike the decayed trees.

Maybe a Lenten resolution for us can be to be more loving and kinder to one another, That way we will become fully ourselves – the way God made us to be, people who speak from our heart's abundance, having an abundance of love and truth.

Since this is the first bulletin of the month, I have a few other items for you.

Lenten Friday Evening Events. Stations of the Cross are being offered every Friday evening at 7 pm. We have a wonderful version of the Stations which I find inspiring. We are showing different inspirational movies Fridays this Lent following Stations of the Cross. The episodes are excellent and a wonderful way to enhance our Lenten journey. We will not have a movie on March 21. That evening we will have a parish fish fry. There will be a free-will offering. I will be the main cook for the meal. Help is always welcome. Please contact Mary Beth or Julie in the parish office if you are willing to help.

Profession of Faith

The profession of faith – also known as the 'Symbol' - is a sign of the identity of the baptized person. The profession



of faith expresses the central content of the faith: it succinctly captures the main truths that a believer accepts and witnesses to on the day of his or her baptism and shares with the entire Christian community for the rest of his or her life.

There are various professions of faith which show the richness of the experience of encountering Jesus Christ. Traditionally, however, there are two that have gained special recognition in the Church: the baptismal creed of the church of Rome and the Nicene-Constantinopolitan creed, originally formulated in 325 at the Council of Nicaea, in present-day Turkey, and then refined at the Council of Constantinople in 381.

"If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For one believes with the heart and so is justified, and one confesses with the mouth and so is saved," (Romans 10:9-10). This passage from St. Paul emphasizes how proclaiming the mystery of faith requires a deep conversion not only in one's words, but above all in one's understanding of God, of oneself and of the world. "To say the Creed with faith is to enter into communion with God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and also with the whole Church which transmits the faith to us and in whose midst, we believe" (CCC 197).
