

Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten

the 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time February 16th, 2025

The readings run the gamut – not quite from A to Z, but from B to W, from "blessed" to "woe." Jeremiah the prophet says, "Cursed is the one who trusts in human beings." That's interesting. I thought we are supposed to trust others, although maybe not everyone. So, what does Jeremiah mean when he says, "Cursed is the one who trusts in human beings?" Well, we must see this in context. He says, after that, "...who seeks his strength in the flesh, whose heart turns away from the Lord." In other words, he is speaking about those who see the body and materials things as ends or even gods in themselves, and not a means to eternal life. If we trust in merely the things we see and not in God, we will have a rude awakening someday.

But trusting in God is good, because the soul can last forever! That's the beauty of the human person. That's the beauty of a new human life. It is the creation of a being that can last forever! The body will decay, but the spirit will last forever. In heaven, we can live with resurrected, glorified bodies.

Jesus gives us four woes in the gospel today as well. He says woe to the rich. Jesus is referring to those who refuse to share their wealth with those not as fortunate. He also says woe to those who are filled now, presuming, of course, that they are selfish and refuse to share. Jesus also says woe to those who laugh now. Jesus just doesn't want us to forget about those who have no reason or cause to laugh because they have not been as blest as you or I. Jesus also says woe to you when all speak well of you. This reminds me of the words of a wise man: "Pride comes before the fall."

In contrast to living with a view to just the things of this world, Jeremiah the prophet calls us to trust in the Lord. Paul says we have good reason to hope in the Lord too, because of the resurrection of Christ from the dead. And in the gospel, Jesus is speaking of a great reversal that will take place someday. Those who could care less about God will wish they did. And so, it is in our best interest to do our best to live as faithful members of the church, the flock of the Lord, and seek to keep Jesus' commandment of love and trust in Him so that we may enter into eternal life. That way, Jesus may say to us someday, "The kingdom of heaven is yours!"

Pack the Pew is Coming! Blessed Sacrament's Parish Lenten Project is "Pack the Pew." The weekend of March 8 we will start to collect non-perishable food items in a designated pew of the church. Food will be collected March 8 through April 6. The items will be divided between our Blessing Box and West Fargo Eats.

<u>Fasting</u>. Lent is more than just "giving something up" and fasting from meat on Fridays.

Pope Francis challenges us to think about fasting as something more powerful, describing it as "learning to change our attitude towards others and all of creation, turning away from the temptation to 'devour' everything to satisfy our voracity and being ready to suffer for love, which can fill the emptiness of our hearts."

At the start of Lent, ask yourself – what pulls me away from loving God, loving others, and loving myself well? How can I incorporate acts of sacrifice, acts of giving, and acts of prayer that will help me love as God loves?

Spend time to thoughtfully consider how to make the most of your experience this year. Because observing Lent is so much bigger than what you "give up."

When we sacrifice things that this world tells us we need, it can remind us that only God can truly satisfy our spiritual hunger.

Lent's three pillars are **prayer**, **fasting** and **almsgiving**—meaning that we're called to do more than just abstain from a particular food or activity. It involves not only what we're willing to give up, but what we're willing to take on.

When we think about what to give up for Lent, we ought to also think about what sort of commitment to prayer and ability to be charitable that we can hold ourselves.

Prayer

There are many reasons and ways to pray, but at the root of prayer is always the desire to be open to God's presence and His offer of love. It is the Spirit of the Son that calls the Christian community to prayer and allows each person to return to the Father. It was Jesus who entrusted His disciples with the Lord's Prayer, which is commented on by the Catechism of the Catholic Church (cf. CCC 2759-2865).

The Christian tradition also offers other texts, such as the Hail Mary, that can help to find words to address God: "By a living transmission—Tradition—the Holy Spirit in the Church teaches the children of God to pray" (CCC 2661).

The prayer opportunities on the journey show that the pilgrim holds the path to God "in his heart" (Psalm 83:6). Refreshment is also provided by the various stops and opportunities for rest along the way, which are often organized around shrines, sanctuaries, and other places filled with spiritual significance, where one realizes that — before us and alongside us — other pilgrims have also passed along and traveled those same roads. Indeed, the paths leading to Rome have often been trod by many saints.
