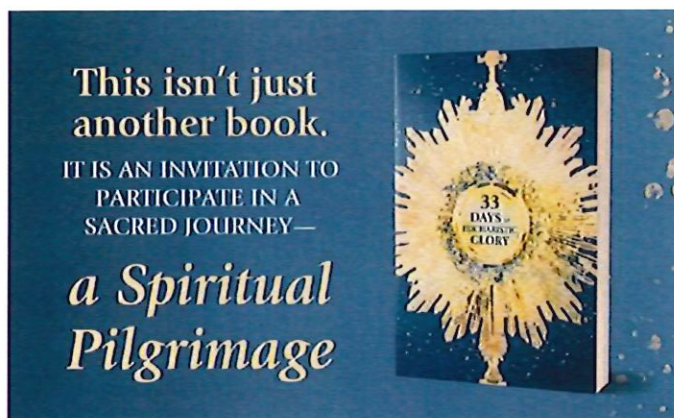

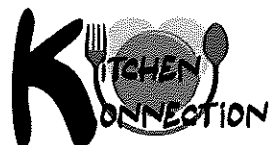

Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten

the 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time February 9, 2025

In today's readings, two people encountered God in a real, deep sense: Isaiah and Peter. They were in awe. In looking at the readings for today, it is quite obvious that God wants us to be aware of his presence in the many ways God comes to us.

One way the Lord comes to us is in the Liturgy. The documents of Vatican II tell us that God really and truly becomes present to us in the presence of the spoken Word. God also comes to us in the presence of the minister. That would include the priest, and all those who are ministering at Mass. The documents teach us that God comes to us in the presence of all of us when we pray and sing. So, it is important to pray and sing, so that we can allow God to be present to us and those around us through these actions. Now I know that not everyone is endowed with an operatic singing voice. And that's OK. If God chose to give us poor singing voices, then we should return the favor by allowing God to listen to us sing! Actually, the scriptures tell us to "make a joyful noise." Notice, it uses the word "noise." So, if it sounds like noise, that's all right, as long as it's joyful!

But God is especially in the Eucharistic species of bread and wine. That's why we genuflect when we come into the church and are in the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. And that's why we bow before receiving Jesus in the Eucharist, both under the form of bread, and, if we choose, under the form of wine.

We are called to be aware of God's presence not just at Mass, but in the world today, along with recognizing God's presence in creation. There are many good Samaritans who do many good deeds – reaching out to those in need physically and spiritually. God is present in them, calling them to reach out to those in need. Then, once we have become aware of God's presence, like Isaiah and Peter, it naturally causes us to think of our sin, and our unworthiness. At least it should cause us to think of that. It causes me to think of that, not to wallow in our sin, but to ask God to cast it out.

May we make time in our busy days to come to develop an awareness of God's presence, like Peter and Isaiah the prophet did in their lives.

Preparing for Lent 2025

**Lent begins on Ash Wednesday
March 5, 2025.**

Collecting Palms: Your old palms can be placed in the marked box by the Parish Office. Please remove plastic bags, paper clips, ribbon, etc., before placing palms in the box.

Begin preparing for the upcoming Lenten Season. What will you do during that time? Will you give something up, or maybe volunteer or get involved at your parish. Will you pray for others intentions? It's never too early to decide what you would commit to during Lent and then hopefully continue after.

Prayer cross will be out beginning on Ash Wednesday. Watch for the cross and a table with blank papers to begin filling out.

Before Ash Wednesday catches you unaware, make a point of sitting down and give some thought to how you want to spend this Lent.

There are three holy practices which we are called to embrace in Lent. These three practices are **prayer, fasting, and almsgiving**.

When you make your Lenten plan, choose something specific from each category—and you're set for a grace-filled journey to Easter.

Prayer Lent is the perfect time to build good prayer habits. It gives us the grace to tackle what we couldn't otherwise. Ask yourself: *what are my prayer habits now?*

We ought to pray every day. Prayer is conversation and communion with the God who made us and loves us. No relationship would flourish if we failed to spend time in the presence of a loved one, conversing with them and offering them genuine attention.

If you are praying once a week at Sunday Mass or saying only a quick "Good morning, God!" as you head to work, make a simple commitment to daily prayer.

How much time should we set aside for daily prayer? Holy priests and spiritual advisors say that fifteen minutes is the absolute minimum. That's a solid goal for all of us.

Prayer is not always easy. It can feel dry, distracted, or lonely. Don't get discouraged—there are things that help inspire, nourish, and strengthen prayer.

Find an engrossing spiritual or devotional series. These things can bring about spontaneous prayer.

In summary: This Lent, try spending at least fifteen minutes in prayer a day. If you already do this, make the Rosary a daily habit. If you already do that, maybe add a Divine Mercy chaplet or a Holy Hour before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Give it some thought and write down your commitment.

Jubilee Year of 2025

Reconciliation

A Jubilee year is a sign of reconciliation because it establishes a "favorable time" (cf. 2 Corinthians 6:2) for conversion. We are called to put God at the center of our lives, growing toward Him and acknowledging His primacy. Even the Biblical call for the restoration of social justice and respect for the earth stems from a theological reality: if God is the creator of the universe, He must be given



priority over every reality and partisan interest. It is God who makes this year holy by bestowing on us His own holiness.

As Pope Francis recalled in the 2015 Bull proclaiming the Extraordinary Holy Year, "Mercy is not opposed to justice but rather expresses God's way of reaching out to the sinner, offering him a new chance to look at himself, convert, and believe. [...] God's justice is his mercy given to everyone as a grace that flows from the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Thus, the Cross of Christ is God's judgement on all of us and on the whole world, because through it he offers us the certainty of love and new life" (Misericordiae Vultus, 21).

In practical terms, reconciliation involves receiving the sacrament of Reconciliation, taking advantage of this time to rediscover the value of confession, and experiencing God's personal words of forgiveness. There are some Jubilee churches that stay open continuously to make available the sacrament of Reconciliation. You can prepare yourself to receive the sacrament by following a guide.

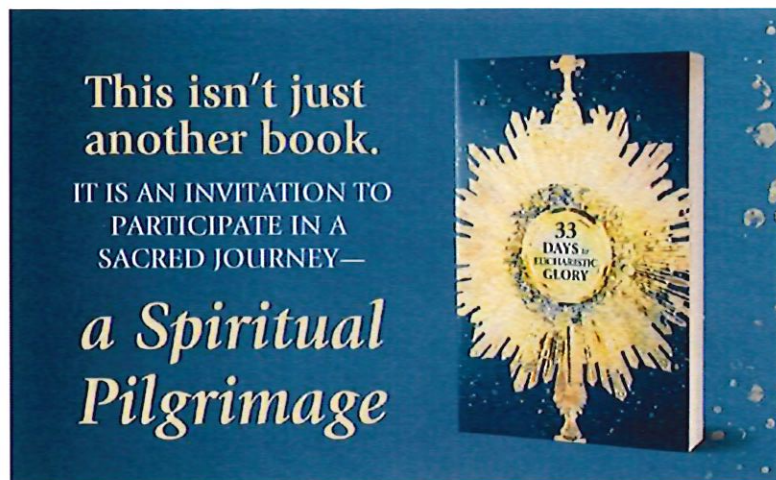




