## Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten

### The 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Lent - March 9, 2025

The gospel today is about temptation. Jesus, in the gospel today, is tempted by the devil. It is an element of our faith that, just as there is a God who created us and redeemed us, there is a devil who has turned away from God. This has implications for us because we are the devil's target. Notice, that's what happened in the gospel today, the devil tried to get back at God by tempting Jesus.

Note the three different types of temptation Jesus had: that of power, wealth, and prestige! One might say, "Jesus should have known better. How could he have let himself be tempted like that?" But, if we must be honest with ourselves, we, too, can allow ourselves to be tempted with power, wealth, and prestige!

We, too, at times are tempted and, at times, it may be by the devil. During this season of Lent, we may be tempted to give in to what we gave up, or to stop doing the things we promised to do, like pray more, help others more, or to attend Church Lenten devotions. But, with the grace of God, we can stay away from times of temptation, most of the time, and we can say no to evil and yes to God.

Notice the one big thing Satan wanted Jesus to do, was to bow down and worship him. It really annoys Satan to see us worshipping not him, but Jesus when we bow down or make a genuflection in Christ's presence. But Jesus withstood the temptations to bow down and worship the devil. How? Notice it says at the beginning of the gospel, prior to his temptation: and Jesus was "full of the Holy Spirit."

We can resist the power of the evil one when we, too, have the presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives. In our prayers, it is good to ask the Holy Spirit to help us. We can resist the power of evil, too, if we have the "spiritual ammunition," if we have the grace of God, given so generously to us in the sacraments. Let us remember that in all of this, God is more powerful, more awesome, greater than any angel, whether it be a good angel, or a fallen angel, such as Satan. We pray that more people would say no to the power of evil in their lives and yes to God.

## Jubilee Year of 2025

### Indulgences

The Jubilee Indulgence is a concrete manifestation of God's mercy, which goes beyond and transforms the boundaries of human justice. This treasury of grace entered human history in the witness of Jesus and the saints, and by living in communion with them our hope for our own forgiveness is strengthened and becomes a certainty. The Jubilee indulgence allows us to free our hearts from the weight of sin because the reparation due for our sins is given freely and abundantly.

In practical terms, the experience of God's mercy involves some spiritual acts indicated by the Pope. Those who cannot make the Jubilee pilgrimage due to illness or other circumstances are nonetheless invited to take part in the spiritual movement that accompanies the Jubilee year, offering up the sufferings of their daily lives, and participating in the Eucharistic celebration.

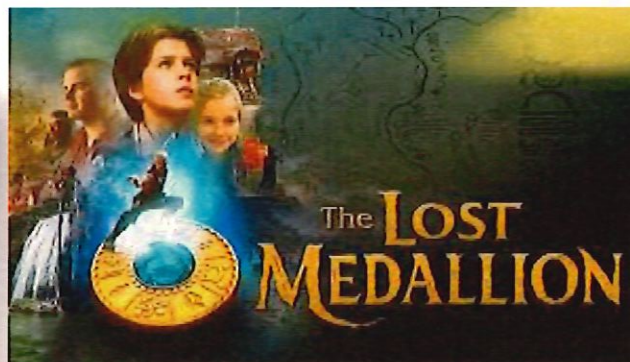
