Stations of the Cross, Our last Lenten Stations of the Cross will be Friday April 11, 7:00 p.m. Our Faith Formation students will be presenting each station in silhouette. All are welcome to attend.

Palm Sunday, April 13, is the last Sunday of Lent. It signifies Jesus's triumphant return to Jerusalem after spending 40 days and nights in the desert. During Mass, we celebrate his return and our desire to follow him.

At Blessed Sacrament we begin the Palm Sunday service in the Social Hall. After the readings, we process into the Church. We follow Fr. Luiten waving our palms in jubilation, reenacting the excitement of Jesus' time. Please listen to the instructions given by Fr. Luiten prior to the procession. *All will process down the center aisle, approach and reverence the altar and proceed to the pews.* Thank you.

Holy Thursday, Stew Supper,

April 17, 5:30-6:30 p.m. Everyone is invited, free will offering. You are welcome to join us for Holy Thursday Mass, following supper, at 7:00 p.m. We will experience the Passion of our Lord.

Use of Incense: We will be using incense during Mass on Holy Thursday (March 28) and the Easter Vigil (March 30).

Ring Those Bells! Bring your small hand bells to ring during the singing of the *Gloria* on Holy Thursday and the Easter Vigil. We have not sung the *Gloria* through the duration of Lent. We ring the bells as we sing it once again and rejoice!

Wear Liturgical Colors During Holy Week. By wearing liturgical colors, we enhance the environment and have a visual reminder that we are experiencing a special liturgy.

Good Friday – Red Easter Vigil – White
Easter Sunday – White

Throughout the Easter Season the color is White.

Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten

the 5th Sunday of Lent - April 6, 2025

Having faith in God is what the readings are about today, particularly the second reading from Paul to the Philippians. Paul states that the gift of faith is important for helping us to attain heaven. And what are the elements of our faith? They are summed up in the Creed, the Seven Sacraments, the Ten Commandments, and prayer. Living these out are all important for a healthy spiritual life.

Faith must be put into practice. Faith and good works are mentioned over and over again in the gospels, and they are important parts of the journey to heaven. The good works are shown in the love we have for one another, the corporal works of mercy such as feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, and other types of almsgiving, which is a common thing to do during Lent. Good works are also practiced in the spiritual works of mercy, such as through praying for one another, through comforting the sorrowful, through counseling the doubtful, and the other spiritual works of mercy.

Paul tells us what faith does in the second reading today. He states that faith enables us to do four things, first, to know Christ. We cannot truly know Jesus without the gift of faith. Second, faith enables us to share in his sufferings by being conformed to His death, which is kind of a strange side-effect of faith. But to share in Christ's sufferings and to be conformed to his death is a good thing, because when we die with Christ, we can rise and live with Christ. Third, faith gives us the ability to forgive. In the gospel today Jesus forgives the woman caught in adultery. Back in Moses' time, adultery was punishable by death. So, Jesus' letting the adulteress go without a punishment was Jesus' way of forgiving her. He didn't condemn her! Finally, faith gives us the ability not to judge others. There may be times when we slip into that sin. We are called to judge another's actions, but not the person. Only God can do that. And so, may God give us the grace to daily care for and nourish the great gift of faith that He has given us.

Since this is the first weekend of the month, I have a few other items for you.

Lenten Reconciliation Service. We will have a number of priests here to help with confessions on Thursday, April 10, 7:00 p.m. Hopefully we will have a good turnout of parishioners to seek repentance and to keep them busy.

Holy Week. Please note the dates and times for Holy Week services, beginning with Palm Sunday Masses, followed by Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. We will be having a young lady being baptized that evening and three adults receiving full communion in the church. Hopefully we will have a good turnout to welcome them into our parish family.

Confirmations. Eleven of our young people will be confirmed at the cathedral on Sunday, April 27 at noon. Let us keep them all in our prayers.

A Brief Examination of Conscience

Based on the Ten Commandments

I am the Lord your God: you shall not have strange Gods before me.

Have I treated people, events, or things as more important than God?

You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.

Have my words, actively or passively, put down God, the Church, or people?

Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day.

Do I go to Mass every Sunday (or Saturday Vigil) and on Holy Days of Obligation (Jan. 1; the Ascension; Aug. 15; Nov. 1; Dec. 8; Dec. 25)? Do I avoid, when possible, work that impedes worship to God, joy for the Lord's Day, and proper relaxation of mind and body? Do I look for ways to spend time with family or in service on Sunday?

Honor your father and your mother.

Do I show my parents due respect? Do I seek to maintain good communication with my parents where possible? Do I criticize them for lacking skills I think they should have?

You shall not kill.

Have I harmed another through physical, verbal, or emotional means, including gossip or manipulation of any kind?

You shall not commit adultery.

Have I respected the physical and sexual dignity of others and of myself?

You shall not steal.

Have I taken or wasted time or resources that belonged to another?

You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

Have I gossiped, told lies, or embellished stories at the expense of another?

You shall not covet your neighbor's spouse.

Have I honored my spouse with my full affection and exclusive love?

You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.

Am I content with my own means and needs, or do I compare myself to others unnecessarily?

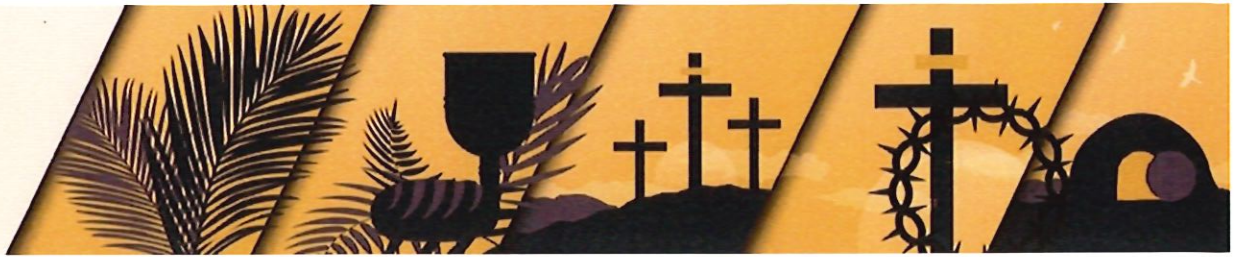
Christ's Two Commandments

How well do we love God and others? Do we love as Christ calls us to? In the gospel of Matthew, Christ gives us Two Commandments: "He said to him, 'You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments'" Mt 22:37-40.

Not Sure what love is? St. Paul describes it for us in his Letter to the Corinthians. Is this how you love God and others: "Love is patient, love is kind, it is not jealous, (love) is not pompous, it is not inflated, it is not rude, it does not seek its own interests, it is not quick-tempered, it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things, Love never fails" 1 Cor 13:4-8.

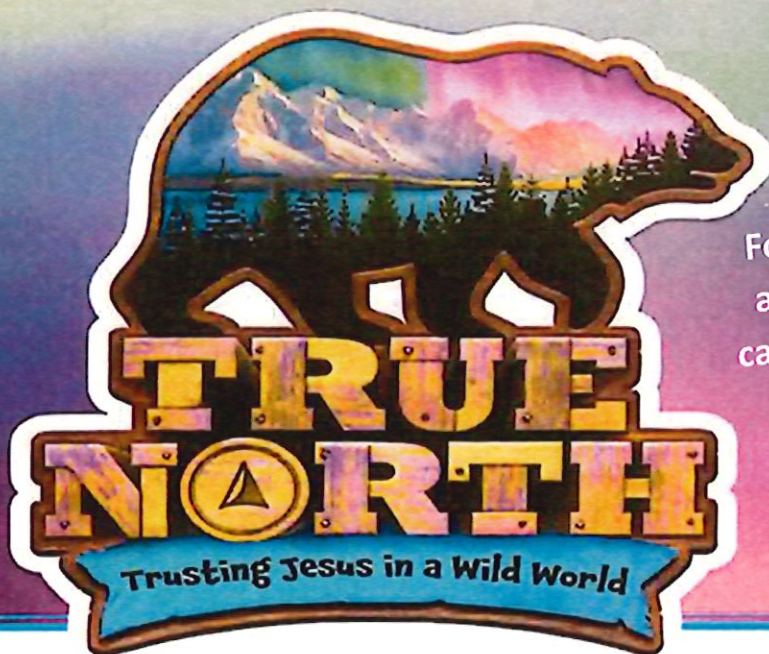
