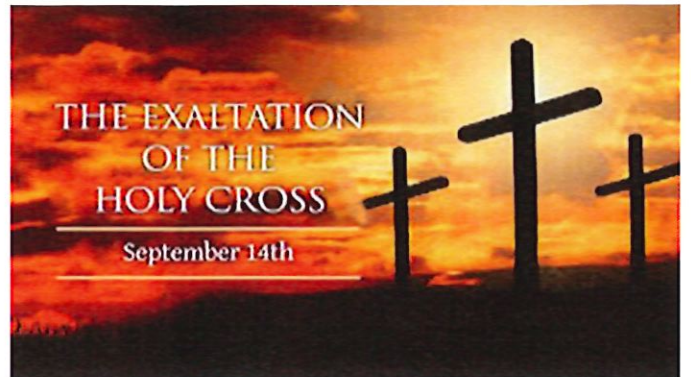

## Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten

**the Feast of the Triumph of the Cross-  
September 14, 2025**

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Triumph of the Cross. It is not a feast we celebrate every year on Sunday, because every year it does not always fall on a Sunday. In the ancient monastic tradition, this day marks the beginning of the dark half of the year while Good Friday marks the beginning of the bright half. As we begin the dark half of the year, we can look to the cross of Christ as a light shining in the darkness of the coming fall and winter. And that is the one thing for us to take back home: the cross as a symbol of hope in a confusing world. For Jesus, the cross was the way for him to be lifted up and exalted to heaven. For us, too, the cross of Jesus should not be seen as a bad or scary thing, but the way for us to be exalted, or lifted up, to new and eternal life.

The Old Testament part of the Bible sets up for us very well the New Testament revelation of and the goodness of the Cross of Christ, and the power Jesus has, having conquered the power of sin by use of the wood of a tree. In the Old Testament, looking back at the history of our salvation, wood was an image of life.

And, most importantly, now, with the Messiah having come, trees are a symbol of life as well. Jesus himself saved us by means of wood, the wood of the cross. Without that cross, we would die in our sins, and never have the opportunity to live forever! So, although the cross is a symbol of death, it is also the symbol of life. The cross of Christ, when we look at it, symbolizes life, because it is in dying with Christ that we can live with Him!

No matter what the cross looks like, the message is the same: Jesus died on the cross to give us life. In today's gospel, Jesus tells Nicodemus, "God sent His only Son, that whoever believes in Him may have eternal life." And that's what we are all after, isn't it? We are all hoping to get to eternal life. And that's why we receive the sacraments, to help us get to heaven.

So let us have hope in that life and in the power of the cross. The saints did. Our ancestors in the faith did. Let us give God the praise, who has won the victory for us by His cross, and calls us to be faithful to Him, leading us to eternal life.
