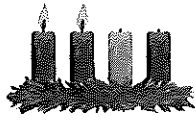

The Second Week of Advent

The Second Candle Represents: **Peace**

Candle Color: **Purple**

This candle signifies Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem. It also symbolizes the peace that Jesus Christ brings to the world.

Advent marks the beginning of the liturgical year. What exactly is the liturgical year? It is the cycle of days observed by many Christians in commemoration of the life of Jesus.

Advent Dates are ever changing. Advent begins four Sundays before Christmas Day; therefore, its beginning date changes every year. Advent always ends on Christmas Eve, December 24.



Fill the Manger with Straw. Mary & Joseph need something warm to place Jesus in when he comes into the world. There will be a manger set up in the Gathering Area with straw next to it. Together let's be positive this Advent season and spread joy, acts of kindness, assist others, compliment others, befriend someone you don't know. Whatever good you do, please place straw in the manger. It needs to be full by Christmas Eve. Let's show Jesus, Mary, and Joseph how special they are.

Prayer Request Board. We all need prayers. Every day of our lives we need The Lord. Next to the manger, in the Gathering Area, we will have a large bulletin board with envelopes to place prayer requests in. Write a prayer(s) on slips of paper and place in the appropriate envelope. Each weekend the prayer envelopes will be placed by the Ambo for us all to pray for the intentions. Following weekend Mass, the basket will be placed by the statue of Mary. She will intercede for us and raise our prayers to the Lord.

Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten

the 2nd Sunday of Advent - December 7, 2025

The gospel this weekend speaks about John the Baptist preparing the people for the coming of Jesus. John echoes the Prophet Isaiah, who tells us to "Prepare the Way of the Lord." Or, we could even say, "Prepare a highway for the Lord," to make it very easy for Jesus to come to us. John's task was to be the "road scout, to be the spiritual "highway engineer" for the greatest dignitary ever to visit this world: the Living God! His task was to see that all was in order for the coming of the Lord.

John's message is for us too, and the message is the same: to prepare the way for the coming of the savior. John prepared the way for Jesus by preaching repentance. Like John, Jesus' task was to preach repentance, too! Jesus' main concern was not love, though that was important, but it was to repent, to change one's mind-set and mental programming. Our paths will lead to error, confusion, and unhappiness, whereas God's roadmap leads to inner peace.

During Advent, in order to help us to prepare the highway for Jesus, there is a "spiritual street sweeper" available for us, in which we prepare our own highway for Jesus, and that is the Sacrament of reconciliation. We will have our parish Advent reconciliation service this Thursday at 7 p.m. It is for those who have big sins, but it also is good for those who have small sins, not that it is necessary to go to the sacrament to have those sins forgiven, but because one receives sacramental grace. The church calls this "sanctifying grace." It is the grace we need to get to heaven someday. And attached to the bulletin this weekend is an examination of conscience which can help us prepare to make a good confession. There are still several other opportunities to receive that sacrament, you can check the bulletin for the other Advent penance services in the area. Also, we still have reconciliation every Saturday at 4 p.m. here at Blessed Sacrament. May the sacrament help us to make the rough ways smooth.

As privileged as we are, living in the years after Jesus' first coming, having learned of His ways, may we not be reluctant or reject Jesus' road-plan. Scripture says, "Now is the acceptable time; now is the day of salvation. Make straight the way of the Lord." May we use these next couple weeks to do just that as we prepare for the birthday of the savior.

And since this bulletin is the first bulletin of the month, I have a few other items for you.

- **Our Deacon, Shawn DeKeyser** – has now officially been appointed to serve here at Blessed Sacrament. Welcome, Deacon Shawn, to our parish staff!
- **Thank you** – to all who helped with the community Thanksgiving Dinner here at Blessed Sacrament. We must have had around 100 volunteers. I know many of you were busy with your own families, and yet some still came earlier in the week or earlier in the day on Thanksgiving to get some work done. God bless you for your generosity. We roasted 130 turkeys, diced up 240 loaves of bread for the stuffing, and served around 2,000 meals, including to-go boxes. Thank you for seeing Jesus in those you helped serve.
- **Advent.** Advent can be a great time for us to come to the Lord, whether it be at Mass or in the sacrament of reconciliation, in our daily prayers, or in the acts of charity that we show to others, including the poor. I encourage each of us to take an ornament from the MinisTREE in the Gathering Area, purchase the gift written on

the ornament, and bring it back to the tree by December 15. These gifts will go to help the Women's Care Center. In this way, we are truly living out the spirit of Advent. Wearing the color for the season, which is purple, to Mass is also a great way to live in the spirit of the season. The color for the 3rd Sunday of Advent is rose. There is also a manger in the gathering area where the baby Jesus will rest at Christmas. The manger needs straw! So, when you do a good deed this Advent, take some straw from the bale and place it in the manger.

May God gently lead us and guide us as we prepare for the awesome celebration of the birth of our savior.

Our Thanksgiving Dinner is a highlight of our parish life, a truly cherished tradition. It is deeply inspiring to witness people from every walk of life come together to share a meal as one family. What makes this event even more remarkable is that we served an astonishing **1,984 meals** in just three hours!

It takes an entire community of willing and able bodies, and that is precisely what the Blessed Sacrament family provides. Gratitude is extended to everyone involved. The dedication is a true blessing.

EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE

Based on The 10 Commandments

1. **I am the Lord your God. You shall not have strange gods before me.**
 - Do I give God time every day in prayer?
 - Do I seek to love Him with my whole heart?

 - Do I seek to surrender myself to God's Word as taught by the Church?
 - Have I ever received Communion in the state of mortal sin?
 - Have I ever deliberately told a lie in Confession or have I withheld a mortal sin from the priest in Confession?
2. **You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.**

3. **Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day.**

4. **Honor your father and your mother.**

 - Have I given my family good religious example?
 - Do I try to bring peace into my home life?
 - Do I care for my aged and infirm relatives?
5. **You shall not kill.**
 - Have I had an abortion or encouraged anyone to have an abortion?
 - Have I physically harmed anyone?
 - Have I abused alcohol or drugs?
 - Did I give scandal to anyone, thereby leading him or her into sin?
 - Have I been angry or resentful?
Have I harbored hatred in my heart?
 - Have I mutilated myself through any form of sterilization?
 - Have I encouraged or condoned sterilization?
6. **You shall not commit adultery.**
 - Have I been faithful to my marriage vows in thought and action?
 - Have I engaged in any sexual activity outside of marriage?
 - Have I used any method of contraception or artificial birth control in my marriage?
 - Has each sexual act in my marriage been open to the transmission of new life?
 - Have I used sex for myself?
 - Have I sought to control my thoughts?
 - Have I respected all members of the opposite sex, or have I thought of other people as objects?
 - Have I been guilty of any homosexual activity?
 - Do I seek to be chaste in my thoughts, words, and actions?
 - Am I careful to dress modestly?
7. **You shall not steal.**
 - Have I stolen what is not mine?
 - Have I returned or made restitution for what I have stolen?
 - Do I waste time at work, school, or at home?
 - Do I gamble excessively, thereby denying my family of their needs?
 - Do I pay my debts promptly?
 - Do I seek to share what I have with the poor?
8. **You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.**
 - Have I lied?
 - Have I gossiped?
 - Have I spoken behind someone else's back?
 - Am I sincere in my dealings with others?
 - Am I critical, negative, or uncharitable in my thoughts of others?
 - Do I keep secret what should be kept confidential?
9. **You shall not desire your neighbor's wife.**
 - Have I consented to impure thoughts?
 - Have I caused them by impure reading, movies, conversation, or curiosity?
 - Do I seek to control my imagination?
 - Do I pray at once to banish impure thoughts and temptations?
10. **You shall not desire your neighbor's goods.**
 - Am I jealous of what other people have?
 - Do I envy the families or possessions of others?
 - Am I greedy or selfish?
 - Are material possessions the purpose of my life?
 - Do I trust that God will care for all of my material and spiritual needs?

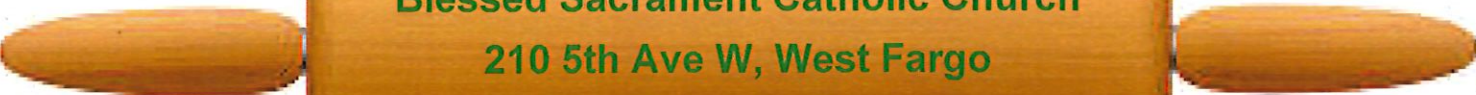
