PARTS OF THE MASS continued...

In last week's bulletin we covered The Introductory Rites. These Rites begin the mass. Following the conclusion of the Introductory Rites we then go into the Liturgy of the Word.

Liturgy of the Word

Most of the Liturgy of the Word is made up of readings from Scripture. On Sundays and solemnities, there are three Scripture readings. During most of the year, the first reading is from the Old Testament and the second reading is from one of the New Testament letters. During Easter Time, the first reading is taken from the Acts of the Apostles which tells the story of the Church in its earliest days. The last reading is always taken from one of the four Gospels.

In the Liturgy of the Word, the Church feeds the people of God from the table of his Word (cf. *Sacrosanctum Concilium*, no. 51). The Scriptures are the word of God, written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. In the Scriptures, God speaks to us, leading us along the path to salvation.

The Responsorial Psalm is sung between the readings. The psalm helps us to meditate on the word of God.

The high point of the Liturgy of the Word is the reading of the Gospel. Because the Gospels tell of the life, ministry, and preaching of Christ, it receives several special signs of honor and reverence. The gathered assembly stands to hear the Gospel and it is introduced by an acclamation of praise. Apart from Lent, that acclamation is "Alleluia," derived from a Hebrew phrase meaning "Praise the Lord!" A deacon (or, if no deacon is present, a priest) reads the Gospel.

After the Scripture readings, the celebrant preaches the homily. In the homily, the preacher focuses on the Scripture texts or some other texts from the liturgy, drawing from them lessons that may help us to live better lives, more faithful to Christ's call to grow in holiness.

In many Masses, the Profession of Faith then follows the homily, either the Nicene or Apostles' Creed. The Nicene Creed is a statement of faith dating from the fourth century, while the Apostles' Creed is the ancient baptismal creed of the Church in Rome. If baptismal promises are renewed, from a formula based on the Apostles' Creed, this takes the place of the Creed.

The Liturgy of the Word concludes with the Universal Prayer, also called the Prayer of the Faithful. The gathered assembly intercedes with God on behalf of the Church, the world, and themselves, entrusting their needs to the faithful and loving God. *(taken from United States Conference of Catholic Bishops)*

Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten

the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time
January 25, 2026

The readings this weekend speak of unity, not just in conversation, but in our faith in particular in the midst of a secular society. Scripture tells us that unity ultimately comes when everyone lives the values and lives Jesus calls us to live. Sadly, there is division today: between ethnic groups called racism, between families, and religious groups. There is division between individuals such as at the workplace and at home among family members. Some don't even speak to each other, even between brothers and sisters! Sometimes we even may have tendencies to push more for division rather than unity. It is against all this division that Jesus has come to unite and to break down the walls that divide people.

That is one reason Jesus began the church. "Church" means "gathering," or "assembly." It is meant to help bind us together. And, incidentally, we are hearing more and more of people including public figures, who say "I'm faithful, I'm Christian, but I don't believe in organized religion." The problem is when you look at the scriptures and what Jesus was doing today, it is difficult to take this stance when, in fact, that was exactly what Jesus was doing when he called the disciples in the gospel: he was organizing his religion, calling, and binding the people together beginning with the twelve. We celebrate every Sunday to help bind us together as a church community. We gather together so Jesus may bring us all together one day in heaven.

And the Lord calls forth a response from us to that invitation to unity, and the calling in the gospel this weekend is loud and clear today: repent! When we receive the Eucharist, we are receiving not just Jesus, but the Father and the Holy Spirit, too. And they are perfectly united. Let our prayer be that we be united with one another and all the members of the Body of Christ as Jesus, the Father, and the Holy Spirit are one. That was Jesus' prayer. And hopefully that will be our prayer as well. May Jesus bind us together as one as He did the apostles and give us the courage we need to do what they did, to go out and spread the good news by our words and deeds.

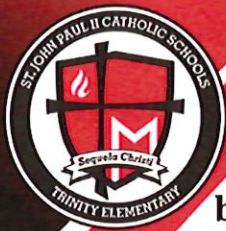

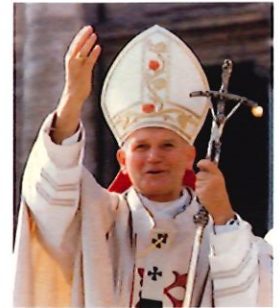
